
John 6:15-21 Context:

- Takes place immediately after the
 - **66** Jesus, knowing that they intended to come and make him king by force, withdrew again to a mountain by himself." ~ JOHN 6:15 (NIV)
 - 66 After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray." ~ MATTHEW 14:23a (NIV)
- When Jesus goes away by Himself to Pray you know
- Jesus sends His disciples out on the water. (*Mark 6:45*) Seas and Water in the Bible often represent

Genesis 1:2, Genesis 7:17-24, Psalm 69:1-2, Job 3:8, Jonah 1:16-17, Revelation 13:1, Revelation 21:1

When evening came, his disciples went down to the lake, ¹⁷ where they got into a boat and set off across the lake for Capernaum. By now it was dark, and Jesus had not yet joined them. ¹⁸ A strong wind was blowing and the waters grew rough. ¹⁹ When they had rowed about three or four miles, they saw Jesus approaching the boat, walking on the water; and they were frightened. ²⁰ But he said to them, 'It is I; don't be afraid.' ²¹ Then they were willing to take him into the boat, and immediately the boat reached the shore where they were heading."

'You of little faith,' he said, 'why did you doubt?'"

Lesson: If you want to walk on water you have to get out of the boat!

Jesus' response to His disciples: "It is I! Do not be afraid." Literally:

- **66** For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith." ~ EPHESIANS 2:8a (NIV)
- If you declare with your mouth, 'Jesus is Lord,' and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." **ROMANS 10:9** (NIV)
