 - Solomon was brought down by ungodly influences. How would you describe the influences that Solomon allowed into his life? What are some of the most challenging influences for Christians today?
 - Solomon was brought down by degrees. How have you ever seen small compromises lead to bigger failure in a persons relationship with God?
- 4 What would you say is the most important lesson you personally have learned in our study of the life of Solomon?
- 5 Bonus Question: If someone told you that 5 Years from now you will have "ship wrecked" your relationship with God what do you think the reason would be?
