

Witherspoon Session Makes a Last Appeal for Members to Submit 2023 Per Capita - Help Close \$2000 Gap

Witherspoon has a long tradition of paying our full Per Capita apportionment to the PCUSA and our Presbytery. We are committed to doing so again for this past year (2023). The Session asks those of you who have not yet paid to please submit your \$40/member per capita amount. If you can add an additional \$40 for members who cannot afford to do so, please do. Per capita connects Presbyterian Church (USA) congregations and mid-councils with the work of the larger Church. Session believes that paying our full per capita is an important element of belonging to a **connectional church** and a recognition that **Witherspoon has received support from the Presbytery and the Synod of the Northeast** over the years. We hope that 50 members will pay \$40 so Witherspoon can close the gap and raise an additional \$2000.
