- Special Joint Committee on Medical Assistance in Dying (AMAD) was tabled in the House of Commons on February 15 recommending that euthanasia be expanded to include children "mature minors."
- Recommendation 19 in the report states:
- That the Government of Canada establish a requirement that, where appropriate, the parents or guardians of a mature minor be consulted in the course of the assessment process for MAID, but that the will of a minor who is found to have the requisite decision-making capacity ultimately take priority.
- This means that parents or guardians may or may not be consulted, in the euthanasia death of a child that is deemed capable of decision-making.

- Gold tends to move first. Copper follows. Energy is moving now.

On to Chapter 3

Here we have the return-ees rebuilding the Altar of Burnt Offerings, and re-establishing the daily sacrifices at the temple site. No foundation had been laid, they were just building the altar and giving \$ to build the foundation.

It has them gathering as one man.

We see this in Acts 2, Acts 4 where people were contributing and sharing all things in common

See it in 1 Cor 1 where Paul urges we all be as one (some say "I'm of Paul, I'm of Cephas etc.. has Christ been divided?)

**What is the culture / language being pushed today?**

Our strength is in our diversity. (Wh.....aaaat???)

So the altar is rebuilt and they start sacrificing.

They then move on to the temple foundation.

- They had the determination
- They had funding
- They had the encouragement from a captor

They had the assembly of carpenters, masons etc traded food and oil with tyrians / sidonians.

(Tyre's destruction started before this but was allowed to be a vassal state until Alexander the Great – whole other study)

After it was finished (foundation) they all gathered

They sang "For He is good, for His lovingkindness is upon Israel forever."

They blew trumpets and worshipped as per directions under King David 500y prior

Ezra 3: 12 Yet many of the priests and Levites and heads of fathers' *households*, the old men who had seen the first temple, wept with a loud voice when the foundation of this house was laid before their eyes, while many shouted aloud for joy, <sup>13</sup> so that the people could not distinguish the sound of the shout of joy from the sound of the weeping of the people, for the people shouted with a loud shout, and the sound was heard far away.

**What is going on here??**

**Haggai 2:3 (NASB)** 'Who is left among you who saw this temple in its former glory? And how do you see it now? Does it not seem to you like nothing in comparison?

11<sup>th</sup> century theologian Aben Ezra says:

not but that the dimensions of this house strictly taken were as large as the former: see [Ezr 6:3](#), but not the courts and appendages to it: besides, what might affect them, there was no likelihood of its being so richly decorated with gold and silver as the former temple, and many things would be wanting in it, as the Urim and Thummim, etc.

The stark realization that there's no way they have the wealth or manpower to build what they built before

God told Haggai to tell Zerubbabel/the people "don't worry, the silver and the gold are mine, you'll build a 2<sup>nd</sup> one and..."

**Haggai 2:9 (NASB)** 'The latter glory of this house will be greater than the former,' says the LORD of hosts, 'and in this place I will give peace,' declares the LORD of hosts."

**If it looks pretty austere compared to the former, how can the glory be greater?**
