OBITUARY

Richard Thompson was born on July 10, 1942, in Allendale, SC, to the late Corrine Miller Thompson and Peter Julius Thompson. He was raised in a Christian home with his siblings Wilson, Mary, William, and John. Deacon Richard Thompson quietly transitioned from this life into eternity on October 9, 2025, at Midlands Health and Rehabilitation Center, Columbia, SC.

Richard was a 1961 graduate of C.V. Bing High School and attended Claflin College in Orangeburg, SC. He first met Dorothy in SC. They met up again in New York. They were married on December 15, 1962, and have been inseparable for over 62 years, marked by love, friendship, and devotion. To this union, two daughters were born: Sherri and Carmen. Richard was a loving and devoted husband and father who often worked two jobs to support his family.

Richard was a Patrolman for the NYC Police Department – 44th Precinct and was a Delegate. Patrolman Thompson was honored by the staff, students, faculty, and administration of Joseph H. Wade Community High School in 1972 for his friendship, help, and devotion to duty, which made their school a better place. He retired after 20 years. For 25 years, Richard was the CEO of R&R Security, Inc. in Westchester County and the Bronx, NY. He was the Chairman of Building 12, 9th Floor, Co-op City, Bronx, NY.

Richard joined Grace Baptist Church under the leadership of Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson, where "he decided" that he would become a "pew member". The rest is history... Richard attended Church School and sang in the Male Chorus. He became a mentor to men, with many whom he touched, becoming leaders in the church. He was the president of the Men's Usher Ministry, the Men's Ministry, and the Security Ministry, the Spiritual Advisor to the Trustee Ministry, and Chairman of the Deacons Ministry. He was ordained to the Diaconate on January 18, 1993.
