**Introduction**

However, the Bible does teach liberty for the believer. I think there might have been some entanglement in this chapter that I would like to avoid. You are welcome to read the chapter yourself and decide if I got it right or not. Chapter 6 is on the danger of the super pastor, and I think we have covered that topic enough. So we move on to the chapters on leadership.

**Chapter 7** Lead like \_\_\_\_\_ - Narrow your \_\_\_\_\_ and expand your \_\_\_\_\_.
