- I. The Desirous Will of God *Continued*
 - a. Thelo and Thelema
 - 8. Ask for yourself (middle voice) according to His will 1 John 5:14. 15
 - a. Christ promised His disciples that they would received whatever they asked the Father in His name
 - i. John 14:13,14 When we ask according to His desirous will, God is glorified
 - ii. John 15:7 Resting in one's relationship to God in Christ and His word being comfortable in us results in believers asking according to His will
 - iii. John 16:23, 24 Up to that point, the disciples had never asked in the name of Jesus
 - God instituting a new means of communication
 - 2. This type of communication was not available to the Old Testament saint
 - b. God hears the believer when their asking is consistent with God's desirous will
 - i. *Akouo* "consider what is or has been said"; the request has been acknowledged
 - "God's will is the standard of the kind of asking which God acknowledges" – Hoelscher
 - 2. When a believer asks for something that is consistent with God's will and His character then He will hear their request
 - c. How does one ask according to God's will?
 - Asking in Jesus' name means asking according to Christ's character, or in other words, ask the same way that Christ would ask
 - ii. It does not mean adding the name of Jesus to the end of one's prayer
 - iii. The Character of Christ
 - 1. Ro. 12:1-2; Heb. 10:5-10 -Willingness to make self available to God
 - 2. Ro. 12:3-5- Being considerate of the Body of Christ
 - 3. Ro. 12:9-13; 1 John 5:1-2 Motivated by love in relationships with the members of the Body
 - 4. 1 Thess. 5:16; John 6:38 An appreciation for the will of God in all things (rejoicing)

- 5. 1 Thess. 5:17; John 17:1-3 Being consistently mindful of the glory of God
- 6. 1 Thess. 5:18; Lk. 22:19 An attitude of gratitude in all things
- d. Asking contrary to the will of God
 - i. James 4:1-4 James addresses believers that were in conflict with one another because they were seeking to gratify their selfish desires
 - 1. Their desires were not being met because they weren't asking
 - 2. They asked so that could totally consume it upon their desires
 - ii. Out of control desiring, yet despite their energetic efforts to get what they want it always out of their reach
- e. The purpose of prayer is not us bending God's will to do our bidding but our will's being brought into conformity with His desirous will
