THE WILL OF GOD

Lesson 13

"And this is the confidence that we have in him, that, if we ask any thing according to his will, he heareth us: And if we know that he hear us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of him." - 1 John 5:14-15

- I. Christ promised His disciples that they would receive whatever they asked the Father in His name
 - A. John 14:13,14 God is glorified when we make requests in line with His desirous will
 - B. John 15: 7, 16 Being at at ease in one's position in Christ, and God's word being at ease in us results in believers asking according to His will
 - C. John 16:23, 24 Before the Upper Room, the disciples had never made requests in the name of Jesus
 - 1. God instituted a new mode of communication following Christ's death and resurrection
 - 2. This type of communication was not available to the Old Testament saint
- II. God hears the believer when their asking is consistent with God's desirous will
 - A. Akouo "consider what visor has been siad" the request has been acknowledged
 - 1. "God's will is the standard of the kind of asking which God acknowledges" Pastor Tim Hoelscher
 - 2. "When a believer asks for something that is consistent with God's will and His character then He will hear their request
- III. How does one ask according to God's will?
 - A. Asking in Jesus' name means asking according to Christ's character, or in other words, asking the same way that Christ would ask
 - B. It does not mean adding the name of Jesus to the end of one's prayer
 - C. The Character of Christ
 - 1. Ro. 12:1-2; Heb. 10:5-10 Willingness to make self available to God
 - 2. Ro. 12:3-5 Being considerate of the Body of Christ
 - 3. Ro. 12:9-13; 1 Jo. 5:1-2 Motivated by love in relationships with the members of the Body
 - 4. 1 Thess. 5:16; Jo. 6:38 An appreciation for the will of God in all things
 - 5. 1 Thess. 5:17; Jo. 17:1-3 Being consistently mindful of the glory of God
 - 6. 1 Thess. 5:18; Lk. 22:19 An attitude of gratitude in all things
- IV. Asking contrary to the will of God
 - A. James 4:1-4 James addresses believers that were in conflict with one another because they were seeking to gratify their selfish desires
 - 1. Their desires were not being met because they weren't asking
 - 2. They asked so that they could totally consume it upon their desires
 - B. Out of control desiring, yet despite their energetic efforts to get what they want, their request is always out of their reach
- V. Purpose of our communication with God not bending God's will to do our bidding but our wills being brought into conformity with His desirous will
