Introduction

- One of the five books of the Law of Moses right in the middle
- Does not contain the ten commandments
 - Exodus 20
 - Deuteronomy 5
- Describes *how* the Lord was to be worshiped

Importance of Leviticus

- Describes entire religious system of ancient Israel
- Provides theological foundation for atoning work
- Demonstrates importance of holiness
- Is a record of the words of God
 - 38 times the Lord spoke to Moses and/or Aaron
 - 18 times the Lord commanded Moses, Aaron, and the people

Importance of Leviticus

- The New Testament frequently alludes to the contents of Leviticus. Writers assume this knowledge, for example the practices of purification after childbirth, washing after healing of a leper, journeys to festivals, and separation from Gentiles. All find their origin in Leviticus

Interpreting/applying OT law

- Old Testament law divided into 3 parts: ceremonial, civil, and moral
- Most of the moral laws are repeated in the New Testament
- Since God gave all the law, can we not learn something about God by studying them?

Interpreting/applying OT law

Seven step method

1. Affirm inspiration and helpfulness (2 Tim 3:16)
2. Affirm fulfillment in Jesus (Luke 24:44)
3. Determine original context
4. Note similarities with today's context
5. Identify principles that apply to both
6. What does the New Testament teach about the principles
7. Apply the principles to your life
