# The Armor of God

### The Believer's Protection against Spiritual Attack

Ephesians 6:12 reminds us that we are not battling against things we can see, flesh and blood, but with spiritual powers of darkness. I believe that today, most believers do not know how to battle spiritually, that they have become accustomed to battling and striving by sight, not by faith.

Christ, before he was to go to to cross, took some important time with his disciples in the upper room. He washed their feet, giving them the new commandment (John 13:33-35). He then walked them through a process that would relieve their fear and anxiety.

#### Let not your heart be troubled... believe

There are two options here, be troubled and anxious, or place trust in God. This has connections to several pieces of the armor. Jesus states in 14:6 that he is the way, the truth, and the life. The first piece of armor is the belt of truth. If we see things the way they really are, again looking to the Words of Christ our fear will dissipate. Christ went away, but he is preparing a place for us and he is coming again. The helmet of salvation guards the believer. The helmet of salvation is the benefits package (containing future tense salvation - the benefits yet to come in our glorification when Christ returns). 1 Thess 5:8-11 walks us through this thought process, even referring to a piece of the armor. John 14 and Phil 4 have a strong connection. Consider the following verses:

- 14:1 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.
- 14:11 Believe me that I am in the Father, and the Father in me: or else believe me for the very works' sake.
- 14:13 And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.
- 14:14 If ye shall ask anything in my name, I will do it.
- 14:27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.
- Php 4:6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
- Php 4:7 And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

Paul refers the believer to worship, supplicate, and make request. Christ tells the disciple to believe the words he has said about himself (the definition of worship) and to make a request that will be answered. Then they both promise peace that will guard the heart and mind. This is the way to use the armor of God.

Let us consider how Satan attacks the believer.
Pride 1 Tim 3:6.
Lying John 8:44
Pride and Anxiety 1 Peter 5:5-7
An Unforgiving Spirit 2 Cor 2:9-11
Spiritual Cowardice Luke 22:31-32

What should the believer's thought process be to counter these attacks?

**Pride** - the breastplate of Righteousness Rom 10:3, Phil 3:9 Our protection from this lust comes from an understanding that we can never come close to the work that Christ has already done. Anything we try to place alongside will pale in comparison to the finished and complete righteousness of Christ. We are not to place anything alongside, but to simply put on Christ. Gal 3:27.

**Lying** - Belt of Truth. Eph 4:25-27 The truth is the counter to the lie and a protection from the Father of Lies.

**Anxiety -** Gospel of Peace (feet Shielded) we spent time with this in John 14 and Phil 4. Worship, be thankful, make request, and God's peace will guard our hearts and minds in our position in Christ. Eph 6:18

An Unforgiving Spirit - Heimet of Salvation Bitterness poisons the vessel that it is in, not who it is intended for or directed at. I have seen numerous individuals that will not forgive some unrighteous act or slight, and then they are tormented with doubt, discouragement, and ultimately depression. We are to forgive others on the basis of how we were forgiven - completely and not on the basis of our merit, but on the merit of Christ Eph 4:32

Spiritual Cowardice - Shield of Faith 2 Thess 1. The passage here gives a contrast to how Peter faced adversity when he denied Christ. The Thessalonians directed the Shield of faith. I believe we also see the helmet of salvation and sword of the Spirit in this passage. Their thoughts were forward directed placing faith in the words of God and it gave them power to live in the current life.

Keeping these examples in mind, we also have other imperatives that will aid in battling the spiritual warfare:

- Be sober minded: calm and collected in one's human spirit. 1 Pet. 5:8, 1 Thess. 5:6-8, 2 Tim. 4:5
- Be vigilant: watchful, giving strict attention to a thing, to be awake. 1 Pet.

The armor of God is made up of mental constructs based on the mind of God. Being spiritual will allow us to discern the mind of God to ward off attacks of the Evil One. We do not have to live in fear or bondage. Greater is He that is in us, than he that is in the world. 1 John 4:4

# The World System

## Co-opted, Designed, and Sustained by Satan

- I. The World System can be a dangerous enemy.
  - A. The world system was defined well by Scofield. The <u>world system</u> is ... the order or arrangement under which Satan has organized the world of unbelieving mankind upon his cosmic principles of force, greed, selfishness, ambition, and pleasure. This world system is imposing and powerful with military might; it is often outwardly religious, scientific, cultured, and elegant: ... and it is dominated by Satanic principles.

      - c. Art (performance and fine)
      - d. Amusement parks
      - e. Video games
      - f. Music personalities (idols)
    - 4. Human government
      - a. Political activism
      - b. Cause inspired activities
    - 5. Consumerism

- D. We are to frame our minds on heavenly things (position and possessions). Col. 3:1-3
  - 1. The word seek in verse 1 is zeteo seek (OT worship), enquire
  - 2. The word for set your affection in verse 2 is franeo exercise our mind, frame the thinking.
- E. A mistranslation in Romans 12:2 causes confusion in some churches. The translation should be "Age" not "world", this leads to Age conformity, a form of Satanic Legalism.
