Question: What does the preface of the Lord's prayer teach us?

Answer: The preface of the Lord's prayer, which is Our Father who is in heaven ⁽¹⁾, teaches us to draw near to God with all holy reverence and confidence, as children to a father, able and ready to help us ⁽²⁾; and that we should pray with and for others ⁽³⁾.
