



**W**elcome: *What is something shocking that you wish you could do before you die?*

**W**orship: Read [Psalm 145](#) or listen to [“O Lord, My Rock and My Redeemer” – Sovereign Grace Music](#)

**W**ord: [Revelation 6:15-17](#), [1 Corinthians 2:9-10](#), [John 16:1-11](#), [Matthew 21:12-17](#)

1. What stood out to you the most in this message?
2. **“Dread”**—Discuss the “dread” Pastor Bryan experienced for two days following his initial vision/experience. What stood out to you as he described it?
  - Why do you think the Lord impressed this experience upon our Pastor and then called him to share with our Body?
3. **“The Mountain” split**— Discuss the vision Pastor Bryan described of the Mountain, split (fractured) in two. What stood out to you as he described this?
  - Where have we seen or experienced “splits based on truth”?
  - Are you willing to be persecuted for telling the truth, individually and as a remnant church? Have you already experienced this?
4. **“I have rejected their priesthood.”** Discuss what Pastor Bryan shared regarding his impressions on what Jesus said and Monterey’s call specific to the Catholic Church, as well as the Jewish people. What stands out to you? (Consider this question in context of “The Mountain and the Tree” structure God has given our Body.)
5. What do you think God is impressing upon your heart after hearing this message?

**W**itness: We have the opportunity to be right in the middle of what Almighty God is doing in this last chapter in history. We are that remnant Church and we must act like the remnant people... who wouldn’t wish this ‘dread’ on their worst enemy, but deeply desire to see all saved. **Prayer:** Sincerely pray together as a group for the Lord to give you passion for His cause and to break your heart for what breaks His... ask Him to do this in whatever way He sees fit (even to the extent of experiencing such dread personally!) so that you will be motivated by what motivates Him... to redeem and save the lost. Because of His great love and mercy, He wishes none to perish, but for all to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9).
