Word: Read 1 Kings 17:1-9

1. What is one thing about the sermon/Scriptures that really stuck out to you, and why?
2. Can you relate to Elijah in the Kerith Ravine? In what ways have you felt isolated, alone, broken down? Did you sense God in the midst?
3. Drinking from the brook and relying on the ravens meant Elijah was totally dependent on the provision of God. How have you been utterly dependent upon God, and how did He follow through?
4. In what ways is it difficult for you to depend on God provision above your own?
5. Read verses 10-24. When the brook dried up, Elijah obeyed God and went on to Zarephath. Why did God dry up the brook, and why was Elijah's obedience so important?
6. Is there a dry brook in your life, or has he dried up brooks in the past? How might God be working in that season?
7. Why is unconditional obedience so important when it comes to our lives and fulfilling our purpose?
8. In what ways is it difficult for you to be obedient to God? What would begin to change if you were? How do you think God would move?

Witness: Consider the faith and courage Elijah; standing up to the evil king, prophesying a famine. Confidently encouraging the woman of God's supernatural provision. Now, when it comes to evangelism and sharing Jesus with others, what's one tangible way for you to step out in faith and courage this week? You may be surprised to see how God provides!
