WORD <u>1 Corinthians 7:1-16</u>

- 1. What stood out to you the most in the message? Why?
- 2. Read 1 Cor. 7:1-2. Who wrote to Paul on the issues of sex and marriage in Corinth and what was his response? Why did he respond that way?
- **3. Read verses 3-4.** What is Paul saying here about authority and yielding to one another in marriage? How did your understanding change or grow in the matter? Share your thoughts.
- 4. "The nuclear fall-out" and competition in the nucleus of the family—Read Genesis 3:16. Discuss why one-ness and solidarity is now difficult, even like tyranny, in a marriage?
 - What is Satan's scheme to tempt us and destroy marriage through the area of sex within marriages?
 - What is the hope we now have in Christ to overcome and obey God's Word?
- 5. Read verses 5-6. For what purpose is Paul saying is acceptable to deprive one another? Why should we be alert when doing so?
- **6. Read verses 6-7.** What does Paul mean when he states that this is a "concession, not a command" and regarding gifts?
- 7. Read verses 8-9; verses 10-11; verses 12-14; verses 15-16. What stood out to you the most in the message concerning the varied situations in which Paul provided guidance to "U.S."?
- **8. Application.** What is your biggest takeaway from Sunday's message? How can you faithfully respond?
