Slide 1: Title God's Unimaginable Love Hosea

Slide 2:

Hosea 1:1-3 (ESV)

The word of the LORD that came to Hosea, the son of Beeri, in the days of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah, kings of Judah, and in the days of Jeroboam the son of Joash, king of Israel.

When the LORD first spoke through Hosea, the LORD said to Hosea, "Go, take to yourself a wife of whoredom and have children of whoredom, for the land commits great whoredom by forsaking the LORD." So he went and took Gomer, the daughter of Diblaim, and she conceived and bore him a son.

Hosea 3:1-3 (ESV)

And the LORD said to me, "Go again, love a woman who is loved by another man and is an adulteress, even as the LORD loves the children of Israel, though they turn to other gods and love cakes of raisins." So I bought her for fifteen shekels of silver and a homer and a lethech of barley. And I said to her, "You must dwell as mine for many days. You shall not play the whore, or belong to another man; so will I also be to you."

Hosea 11:8-11 (ESV)
How can I give you up, O Ephraim?
How can I hand you over, O Israel?
How can I make you like Admah?
How can I treat you like Zeboiim?
My heart recoils within me;
my compassion grows warm and tender.
I will not execute my burning anger;
I will not again destroy Ephraim;
for I am God and not a man,
the Holy One in your midst,
and I will not come in wrath.
They shall go after the LORD;

he will roar like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west; they shall come trembling like birds from Egypt, and like doves from the land of Assyria, and I will return them to their homes, declares the LORD.

Slide 5:

Messaging of the Twelve

- 1) Repent, and God may yet reverse impending judgment
- 2) If no repentance, this is what God will do
- 3) Regardless of the response, there is hope for future healing

Slide 6:

Hosea offers a House of Faith Hosea's name means "Salvation"

Slide 7:

"You asked for a loving God: you have one. The great spirit you so lightly invoked, the 'lord of terrible aspect,' is present: not a senile benevolence that drowsily wishes you to be happy in your own way, not the cold philanthropy of a conscientious magistrate, nor the care of a host who feels responsible for the comfort of his guests, but the consuming fire Himself, the Love that made the worlds, persistent as the artist's love for his work and despotic as a man's love for a dog, provident and venerable as a father's love for a child, jealous, inexorable, exacting as love between the sexes. How this should be, I do not know: it passes reason to explain why any creatures, not to say creatures such as we, should have a value so prodigious in their Creator's eyes."

Isaiah 54:4-5 (ESV)

"Fear not, for you will not be ashamed;

be not confounded, for you will not be disgraced...

For your Maker is your husband"

Slide 12:

Jeremiah 31:32 (ESV)

"(My new covenant will) not be like the covenant that I made with their fathers on the day when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt, my covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, declares the LORD."

Slide 13:

God voluntarily binds Himself to the joy or sadness of His creation through marriage

Slide 14:

The intimacy of marriage makes both parties extremely vulnerable

Slide 15:

Isaiah 62:5 (ESV)

"...as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you."

God's Love Like Marriage To A Bad Spouse

Lo-Ammi = "Not Mine"

Slide 18:

Hosea 2:8 (ESV)

"And she did not know

that it was I who gave her

the grain, the wine, and the oil,

and who lavished on her silver and gold"

When it is "going well" for us (or others) it may not be a sign from God that He is pleased with us.

Slide 20:

Why purchase her?

So Hosea could experience God's love for His people.

So Hosea's heart would be broken

Recoil = Haphak = "Demolished like an overthrown city"
