Slide 1: For God So Loved John 3:16

Slide 2: John 3:16 (ESV) "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

Slide 13: Isaiah 45:22 (KJV 1900) Look unto me, and be ye saved, all the ends of the earth: For I am God, and there is none else.
