B) Group Discussion

- 1. Read Isaiah 40:1-11. Does this text bring comfort to you? Why or why not? What questions do you have of this text?
- 2. Maybe spend a few minutes sharing the joy and pain that the Christmas season brings into our lives as preparation for Advent.
- 3. Comfort comes through discomfort. It's on the other side of hardship. Can you explain this? Give examples in your own life?
 - 1. (Would chapter 40 be comforting to a people who were "on top of the world?")
- 4. Majesty! Power! A God who controls everything. He rules and reigns!
 - 1. Why would you and I not find this desirable, and what would have to happen to make it so?
 - 2. Is personal autonomy realistic? Is it desirable for a Christian?
- 5. Glory! Permanence! Weight! A God who is what He is forever. Actual value.
 - 1. Why would you and I not find this desirable? What happens to us in the midst of this kind of glory? (Isaiah 40:6-8) So what must happen for us to desire that experience with Him and about ourselves?
- 6. Grace! We are free! We get off without paying our own debt!
 - 1. Why would you and I not find this desirable? What would need to happen to us in order for us to truly accept it?
- 7. God says that His judgment has "two-sides" in verse 2. The judgment is "kephel" meaning "double-overed" meaning an obvious side, and something hidden beneath.
 - 1. We know now what the hidden side was (Jesus birth and death). Why was this sooooo very important that this was "hidden" from plain sight?
 - 1. (Hint: Don't think humans, think of the spiritual realm)
