B. GROUP DISCUSSION

1) Read Colossians 1:9-14. What do you see in this prayer? What is Paul praying for? Why do you think this church is lacking in knowledge and understanding?

2) How hard is it to love and to be truthful? Can you think of instances where you felt like you had to choose one over the other? What is the problem with "love" becoming the defining essence of the church at the expense of truth? What is the problem with "truth" becoming the defining essence of the church at the expense of love? Did Jesus die because He loved us, or because truth demanded a substitution? (Hint: They MUST be held together)

3) Paul prays that they (we) walk in a manner worthy of the Lord to be fully pleasing to God. How is that possible?

4) Is it possible that all of our problems derive from not fully understanding or appropriating that Jesus did something to qualify, deliver and transfer us? What are we still looking for? Why do we still feel like we need deliverance?

5) Prayer and praise
