Slide 1: Full in Christ Colossians 2:1-15

Slide 2:

Colossians 2:1-15 ESV

For I want you to know how great a struggle I have for you and for those at Laodicea and for all who have not seen me face to face, that their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, to reach all the riches of full assurance of understanding and the knowledge of God's mystery, which is Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. I say this in order that no one may delude you with plausible arguments. For though I am absent in body, yet I am with you in spirit, rejoicing to see your good order and the firmness of your faith in Christ.

Slide 3:

Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. See to it that no one takes you captive by philosophy and empty deceit, according to human tradition, according to the elemental spirits of the world, and not according to Christ. For in him the whole fullness of deity dwells bodily, and you have been filled in him, who is the head of all rule and authority.

Slide 4:

In him also you were circumcised with a circumcision made without hands, by putting off the body of the flesh, by the circumcision of Christ, having been buried with him in baptism, in which you were also raised with him through faith in the powerful working of God, who raised him from the dead. And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with him, having forgiven us all our trespasses, by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This he set aside, nailing it to the cross. He disarmed the rulers and authorities and put them to open shame, by triumphing over them in him.

B. GROUP DISCUSSION

1) Read Colossians 1:1-15. What is the big problem Paul is addressing? Do we think it is easier or more difficult today to be swayed by "plausible arguments" that lead us away from the sufficiency of Christ?

2) Talk about the meaning of these 3 words:

1) Jesus (Savior)

2) Messiah (Anointed One Promised from Genesis 3)

3) The Lord (Total allegiance due to Him)

Explain how maybe most of our own drifting comes from not really activating, or believing in one of these names.

What (who) else do you hope will save you?

What (who) else do you obey without question? Joyfully obey?

What (wh0) else has become the promise you are awaiting for fulfillment?

3) Jesus explains the life, burial and resurrection of Jesus. He does this to combat the weird philosophies that had come into the church. How does Baptism give us a picture of entering into His life, death and burial? If our hearts must be circumcised, how can that happen?

4) So if emptiness, and combating that emptiness, is part of our growth process, how may these strategies help us to go to the right place for filling?

1) Read your Bible!

- 2) Keep Gathering to Worship
- 3) Take in Gospel Preaching/Teaching
- 4) Partake in Communion/Baptism
- 5) Talk to God
- 6) Journal

7) Meditate

What other ways have you found/employed that keep you close to Christ?

5) How may these other areas give us "plausible arguments" but send us further from the filling that we need *if we are not careful?*

1) Read a good book to "understand" something better

2) Talk to a friend or a family member, someone to provide comfort.

5) Blog or podcast on the topic

6) Seek professional counseling
