Passion

"Let your fountain be blessed, and rejoice in the wife of your youth, a lovely deer, a graceful doe. Let her breasts fill you at all times with delight; be intoxicated always in her love."

Friendship

"who forsakes the **companion** of her youth and forgets the covenant of her God..."

ALPH (Aw-loof) = Intimate friendship (best/closest)

Slide 11:

All 3 together = Gospel Re-enactment

Slide 12:

Ephesians 5:25–27 (ESV)

Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, so that he might present the church to himself in splendor...

Slide 13:

Parent to Child

"Folly is bound up in the heart of a child, but the rod of discipline drives it far from him." "The father of the righteous will greatly rejoice; he who fathers a wise son will be glad in him."

Primary Relationship: Instill Wisdom

Slide 15:

Instilling Wisdom expresses "delight."
"My son, do not despise the LORD's discipline or be weary of his reproof, for the LORD reproves him whom he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights."

Slide 16:

Child to Parent

"My son, do not despise..."

Do not: resent, be weary, become bitter, turn away, etc.

Slide 17:

Primary Relationship: Honor the Parents

"Make their leadership a joy and not a burden!"

The Gospel provides the ultimate Parent/Child example

Proverbs mentions 3 areas foundational to a Marriage Relationship. Take a look at each one and discuss why they are important, and how we get "off-track" in each.

- a) Covenant (not the promise of how I feel, but who I will be forever)
- b) Passion ("fountain be blessed") (For the Brave! How does Proverbs 15:17, 21:9, 21:19, 25:24 relate? An adulterous woman doesn't care if the shoes aren't picked up! How close is respect and romance for men?)
- c) Friendship (intimate friendship, best friend)
- 3) Parent to Child Relationship

Proverbs mentions the instillation of Wisdom as the basis for this relationship. How is this different than:

- a) Moral control and training
- b) Affirmation and love
- 4) Child to Parent Relationship

Proverbs mentions Honor as the basis of this relationship. How is this different than:

- a) Obedience
- b) "Liking" your parents as friends
