3. Each character had their own history and baggage as victims and/or as villains. How did God use each character's story to bring about a bottoming out?

  - c. Joseph
4. How does God save us? Discuss the dynamic between desperation to revelation. Do you see this dynamic at work with each of the characters? Within your own life story and track record as victim or villain? Share with one another, as the Lord leads.
5. It has been said that Joseph is a "Christ figure," or a type of Christ. Where do you see this possibility the most clearly?
