Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

"And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.

Pray then like this:

"streets" = rhymais = back lane

Matthew 6:5

"For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners"

"street" = plateion = main street

One of the only things you do "for" God that you know you aren't doing for show is prayer.

Matthew 6:7

"Do not heap up "empty phrases" as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words."

"battalogeo" = babble

Shoe 1: Prayer that is not exhibiting a real relationship

Shoe 2: Prayer that is trying to control and obligate God

How do we pray?

1) Know who He is to you: "Our Father"

Kingdom prayer is always family-oriented prayer

Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane

Slide 19:

Jesus "lost" the Father
Jesus was judged, not forgiven
Jesus was not delivered from evil, but became evil
In the end we are saved by Jesus submission in prayer:
"nevertheless, not my will, but Thine be done."

B. GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. Read Matthew 6:5-15. Talk about what the "Lord's Prayer" has meant to you over the years. Have you ever utilized it as a prayer guide?
- 2. Talk about shoe 1: Hypocrites

Do you pray when you are alone more than you pray in public? How do you maintain a relationship with God? Why is prayer one of the easiest things to know if you are doing it for "show."

Do you sometimes think that it is your job to convince God to do something for you? Talk about times when you prayed in such a way that prayer had an opportunity to not work for you. Why should prayer heal anxiety?

4. Jesus said to "pray like this:"

Talk about each one separately

- 1) Family relationship: why is prayer for those who are saved?
- 2) Awe-filled adoration: how is prayer a way to plunge into God's identity? Why is this important?
- 3) Submission: is the purpose of prayer to change God or to change us?
- 4) Petition: what do we ask for?
- a) Healing of our world
- b) Daily presence
- c) Forgiveness
- d) Spiritual protection
- 5. Why does prayer ALWAYS WORK if we pray like Jesus asked us to pray?
- 6. How does Jesus prayer in the Garden help us to understand the depth and purpose of prayer?
- 7. Prayer and praise
