Genesis 42:6–9 (ESV) ⁶Now Joseph was governor over the land. He was the one who sold to all the people of the land. And Joseph's brothers came and bowed themselves before him with their faces to the ground. ⁷Joseph saw his brothers and recognized them, but he <u>treated them like strangers</u> <u>and spoke roughly to them.</u> "Where do you come from?" he said. They said, "From the land of Canaan, to buy food." ⁸And Joseph recognized his brothers, but they did not recognize him. ⁹And Joseph remembered the dreams that he had dreamed of them. And he said to them, "You are spies; you have come to see the nakedness of the land."

Genesis 42:17–25 (ESV) ¹⁷And he put them all together in custody for three days. ¹⁸On the third day Joseph said to them, "Do this and you will live, for I fear God: ¹⁹if you are honest men, let one of your brothers remain confined where you are in custody, and let the rest go and carry grain for the famine of your households, ²⁰and bring your youngest brother to me. So your words will be verified, and you shall not die." And they did so. ²¹Then they said to one another, "In truth we are guilty concerning our brother, in that we saw the distress of his soul, when he begged us and we did not listen. That is why this distress has come upon us." ²²And Reuben answered them, "Did I not tell you not to sin against the boy? But you did not listen. So now there comes a reckoning for his blood." ²³They did not know that Joseph understood them, for there was an interpreter between them. ²⁴Then he turned away from them and wept. And he returned to them and spoke to them. And he took Simeon from them and bound him before their eyes. ²⁵And Joseph gave orders to fill their bags with grain, and to replace every man's money in his sack, and to give them provisions for the journey. This was done for them.

Life Principle: God Arranges The Circumstances Of Life To Lead Us To Repentance When We Have Sinned.

James 4:8–10 (ESV) ⁸Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you. Cleanse your hands, you sinners, and purify your hearts, you double-minded. ⁹Be <u>wretched</u> and <u>mourn</u> and <u>weep</u>. Let your <u>laughter be turned to mourning</u> and your joy to gloom. ¹⁰Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you.

Genesis 43:33–44:2 (ESV) ³³And they sat before him, the firstborn <u>according to his birthright</u> and the youngest according to his youth. And the men <u>looked at one another in amazement</u>. ³⁴Portions were taken to them from Joseph's table, but <u>Benjamin's portion was five times as much</u> as any of theirs. And they drank and were <u>merry with him</u>. ¹Then he commanded the steward of his house, "Fill the men's sacks with food, as much as they can carry, and put each man's money in the mouth of his sack, ²and <u>put my cup</u>, the silver cup, in the mouth of the sack of the youngest, with his money for the grain." And he did as Joseph told him.

Genesis 44:33 (ESV) <u>Judah</u> Speaking: ³³Now therefore, please let your servant remain instead of the boy as a servant to my lord, and let the boy go back with his brothers.

Life Principle: God Arranges The Circumstances Of Life To Test If Our Repentance Is Genuine And Has Therefore Resulted In Changed Behavior.

Genesis 45:1–15 (ESV) ¹Then Joseph could not control himself before all those who stood by him. He cried, "Make everyone go out from me." So no one stayed with him when Joseph made himself known to his brothers. ²And he wept aloud, so that the Egyptians heard it, and the household of Pharaoh heard it. ³And Joseph said to his brothers, "I am Joseph! Is my father still alive?" But his brothers could not answer him, for they were dismayed at his presence. ⁴So Joseph said to his brothers, "Come near to me, please." And they came near. And he said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. ⁵And now do not be distressed or angry with yourselves because you sold me here, for God sent me before you to preserve life. ⁶For the famine has been in the land these two years, and there are yet five years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. ⁷And God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. ⁸So it was not you who sent me here, but God. He has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house and ruler over all the land of Egypt. ⁹Hurry and go up to my father and say to him, 'Thus says your son Joseph, God has made me lord of all Egypt. Come down to me; do not tarry. ¹⁰You shall dwell in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near me, you and your children and your children's children, and your flocks, your herds, and all that you have. ¹¹There I will provide for you, for there are yet five years of famine to come, so that you and your household, and all that you have, do not come to poverty.' ¹²And now your eyes see, and the eyes of my brother Benjamin see, that it is my mouth that speaks to you. ¹³You must tell my father of all my honor in Egypt, and of all that you have seen. Hurry and bring my father down here." ¹⁴Then he fell upon his brother Benjamin's neck and wept, and Benjamin wept upon his neck. ¹⁵And he kissed all his brothers and wept upon them. After that his brothers talked with him.

Genesis 45:22–24 (ESV) ²²To <u>each and all of them he gave a change of clothes</u>, but to Benjamin he gave three hundred shekels of silver and five changes of clothes. ²³To his father he sent as follows: ten donkeys loaded with the good things of Egypt, and ten female donkeys loaded with grain, bread, and provision for his father on the journey. ²⁴Then he sent his brothers away, and as they departed, he said to them, "<u>Do not quarrel on the way."</u>

Life Principle: Christians Should Be Eager To Forgive Those Who Have Mistreated Or Wronged Them.

Ephesians 4:32 (ESV) ³²Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as (in same manner) God in Christ forgave you.

Life Principle: Christians Should Demonstrate Their Forgiveness By Extravagant Acts Of Intimacy And Kindness.

Genesis 50:19a, 21. But Joseph said to them, "<u>Don't be afraid</u>....21 So then, <u>don't be afraid</u>. <u>I will</u> <u>provide for you and your children</u>." And he <u>reassured them</u> and <u>spoke kindly to them</u>.
