Bible Recap Exodus: Exodus 21:1 February 12, 2023

Life Principle: God Laws In Exodus 21-23 Express His Expectation And Command That We Treat All People With Kindness And Justice.

Exodus 21:1–6 (ESV) ¹"Now these are the rules that you shall set before them. ²When you buy a Hebrew slave, he shall serve six years, and in the seventh he shall go out free, for nothing. ³If he comes in single, he shall go out single; if he comes in married, then his wife shall go out with him. ⁴If his master gives him a wife and she bears him sons or daughters, the wife and her children shall be her master's, and he shall go out alone. ⁵But if the slave plainly says, 'I love my master, my wife, and my children; I will not go out free,' ⁶then his master shall bring him to God, and he shall bring him to the door or the doorpost. And his master shall bore his ear through with an awl, and he shall be his slave forever.

Life Principle: Employers And Employees Shall Not Take Advantage Of One Another.

Exodus 21:7–11 (ESV) ^{7"}When a man sells his daughter as a slave, she shall not go out as the male slaves do. ⁸If she does not please her master, who has designated her for himself, then he shall let her be redeemed. He shall have no right to sell her to a foreign people, since he has broken faith with her. ⁹If he designates her for his son, he shall deal with her as with a daughter. ¹⁰If he takes another wife to himself, he shall not diminish her food, her clothing, or her marital rights. ¹¹And if he does not do these three things for her, she shall go out for nothing, without payment of money.

Ex 21:16 16"Whoever steals a man and sells him, and anyone found in possession of him, shall be put to death.

Ex 21:12–15, 17 ¹²"Whoever strikes a man so that he dies shall be put to death. ¹³But if he did not lie in wait for him, but God let him fall into his hand, then I will appoint for you a place to which he may flee. ¹⁴But if a man willfully attacks another to kill him by cunning, you shall take him from my altar, that he may die. ¹⁵"Whoever strikes his father or his mother shall be put to death... ¹⁷"Whoever curses his father or his mother shall be put to death.

Life Principle: People Are Not To Be Punished For Accidents But Are To Be Punished For Intentional Acts Of Physical Harm.

Matthew 15:3–6 (ESV) ³He answered them, "And why do you break the commandment of God for the sake of your tradition? ⁴For God commanded, 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'Whoever reviles father or mother must surely die.' ⁵But you say, 'If anyone tells his father or his mother, "What you would have gained from me is given to God," ⁶he need not honor his father.' So for the sake of your tradition you have made void the word of God.

Exodus 21:18–21 (ESV) ¹⁸"When men quarrel and one strikes the other with a stone or with his fist and the man does not die but takes to his bed, ¹⁹then if the man rises again and walks outdoors with his staff, he who struck him shall be clear; only he shall pay for the loss of his time, and shall have him thoroughly healed. ²⁰"When a man strikes his slave, male or female, with a rod and the slave dies under his hand, he shall be avenged. ²¹But if the slave survives a day or two, he is not to be avenged, for the slave is his money.

Life Principle: Victims Of Wrongdoing Should Be Fairly But Not Excessively Compensated.

Exodus 21:26–27 (ESV) ²⁶"When a man strikes the eye of his slave, male or female, and destroys it, he shall let the slave go free because of his eye. ²⁷If he knocks out the tooth of his slave, male or female, he shall let the slave go free because of his tooth.

Exodus 21:22–25 (ESV) ²²"When men strive together and hit a pregnant woman, so that her children come out, but there is no harm, the one who hit her shall surely be fined, as the woman's husband shall impose on him, and he shall pay as the judges determine. ²³But if there is harm, then you shall pay life for life, ²⁴eye for eye, tooth for tooth, hand for hand, foot for foot, ²⁵burn for burn, wound for wound, stripe for stripe.

Life Principal: Punishment For Wrongdoing Should Be Always Conform To The Degree Of The Wrongdoing.

Exodus 22:1–3 (ESV) ¹ "If a man steals an ox or a sheep, and kills it or sells it, he shall repay five oxen for an ox, and four sheep for a sheep. ²If a thief is found breaking in and is struck so that he dies, there shall be no bloodguilt for him, ³but if the sun has risen on him, there shall be bloodguilt for him. He shall surely pay. If he has nothing, then he shall be sold for his theft.

Life Principal: Self-Defense Is Allowable But Unnecessary Or Excessive Force Will Be Punished Accordingly.

Exodus 22:16–17 (ESV) ¹⁶"If a man seduces a virgin who is not betrothed and lies with her, he shall give the bride-price for her and make her his wife. ¹⁷If her father utterly refuses to give her to him, he shall pay money equal to the bride-price for virgins.

Life Principal: Sexual Intimacy Without The Commitment And Responsibility Of Marriage Is Wrong In God's Eyes.

Exodus 22:21–27 (ESV) ²¹"You shall not wrong a sojourner or oppress him, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt. ²²You shall not mistreat any widow or fatherless child. ²³If you do mistreat them, and they cry out to me, I will surely hear their cry, ²⁴and my wrath will burn, and I will kill you with the sword, and your wives shall become widows and your children fatherless. ²⁵"If you lend money to any of my people with you who is poor, you shall not be like a moneylender to him, and you shall not exact interest from him. ²⁶If ever you take your neighbor's cloak in pledge, you shall return it to him before the sun goes down, ²⁷for that is his only covering, and it is his cloak for his body; in what else shall he sleep? And if he cries to me, I will hear, for I am compassionate.

Life Principal: God's People Have A Special Obligation To Treat The Disadvantaged Or Vulnerable With Justice.

Luke 6:34–35 (ESV) ³⁴And if you lend to those from whom you expect to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to get back the same amount. ³⁵But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return, and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he is kind to the ungrateful and the evil.

Exodus 23:9–11 (ESV) ^{9"}You shall not oppress a sojourner. You know the heart of a sojourner, for you were sojourners in the land of Egypt. ^{10"}For six years you shall sow your land and gather in its yield, ¹¹but the seventh year you shall let it rest and lie fallow, that the poor of your people may eat; and what they leave the beasts of the field may eat. You shall do likewise with your vineyard, and with your olive orchard.

Exodus 23:4–5 (ESV) 4"If you meet your enemy's ox or his donkey going astray, you shall bring it back to him. 5If you see the donkey of one who hates you lying down under its burden, you shall refrain from leaving him with it; you shall rescue it with him.

Life Principal: God's People Have A Responsibility To Even Treat Their Enemies With Kindness.

Luke 6:27–28 (ESV) ²⁷"But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.
