Bible Recap Leviticus: Leviticus 11:1 March 26, 2023

Life Principle: The Purity Laws Illustrate That God Is The Ultimate In Holy And That Nothing Unclean, Nothing That Is Not 100% Right In Every Sense Can Dwell Close To Him.

Leviticus 11:3–4 (ESV) ³Whatever parts the hoof and is cloven-footed and chews the cud, among the animals, you may eat. ⁴Nevertheless, among those that chew the cud or part the hoof, you shall not eat these: The camel, because it chews the cud but does not part the hoof, is unclean to you.

Leviticus 12:2 (ESV) ²"Speak to the people of Israel, saying, If a woman conceives and bears a male child, then she shall be unclean seven days. As at the time of her menstruation, she shall be unclean.

Leviticus 13:45–46 (ESV) ⁴⁵"The leprous person who has the disease shall wear torn clothes and let the hair of his head hang loose, and he shall cover his upper lip and cry out, 'Unclean, unclean.' ⁴⁶He shall remain unclean as long as he has the disease. He is unclean. He shall live alone. His dwelling shall be outside the camp.

Leviticus 14:44–45 (ESV) ⁴⁴then the priest shall go and look. And if the disease has spread in the house, it is a persistent leprous disease in the house; it is unclean. ⁴⁵And he shall break down the house, its stones and timber and all the plaster of the house, and he shall carry them out of the city to an unclean place.

Life Principle: Things Or People Were Clean Or Unclean Depending On How Close They Were To Complete "Rightness."

Life Principle: A Person Could Be In A State Of Uncleanness Without Being In A State Of Sin.

Leviticus 11:2–4, 9-10, 20-21. (ESV) ²"Speak to the people of Israel, saying, These are the living things that you may eat among all the animals that are on the earth. ³Whatever parts the hoof and is cloven-footed and chews the cud, among the animals, you may eat. ⁴Nevertheless, among those that chew the cud or part the hoof, you shall not eat these: The camel, because it chews the cud but does not part the hoof, is unclean to you..... ⁹"These you may eat, of all that are in the waters. Everything in the waters that has fins and scales, whether in the seas or in the rivers, you may eat. ¹⁰But anything in the seas or the rivers that does not have fins and scales, of the swarming creatures in the waters and of the living creatures that are in the waters, is detestable to you.... ²⁰"All winged insects that go on all fours are detestable to you. ²¹Yet among the winged insects that go on all fours you may eat those that have jointed legs above their feet, with which to hop on the ground.

Life Principle: The Kosher And Other Purity Laws In The Old Testament Were Meant To Be Spiritually Protective And Instructive.

Leviticus 11:45–47 (ESV) ⁴⁵For I am the Lord who brought you up out of the land of Egypt to be your God. <u>You shall therefore be holy, for I am holy</u>." ⁴⁶This is the law about beast and bird and every living creature that moves through the waters and every creature that swarms on the ground, ⁴⁷to make a distinction between the unclean and the clean and between the living creature that may be eaten and the living creature that may not be eaten.

Hebrews 5:14 (ESV) ¹⁴But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to <u>distinguish good from evil</u>.

Mark 7:18–19 (ESV) ¹⁸And he said to them, "Then are you also without understanding? Do you not see that whatever goes into a person from outside cannot defile him, ¹⁹since it enters not his heart but his stomach, and is expelled?" (Thus he declared all foods clean.)

Romans 14:14 (ESV) ¹⁴I know and am persuaded in the Lord Jesus that nothing is unclean in itself, but it is unclean for anyone who thinks it unclean.

Acts 10:13–15 (ESV) ¹³And there came a voice to him: "Rise, Peter; kill and eat." ¹⁴But Peter said, "By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean." ¹⁵And the voice came to him again a second time, "What <u>God has made clean</u>, do not call common."

Numbers 12:10–12 (ESV) ¹⁰When the cloud removed from over the tent, behold, Miriam was leprous, like snow. And Aaron turned toward Miriam, and behold, she was leprous. ¹¹And Aaron said to Moses, "Oh, my lord, do not punish us because we have done foolishly and have sinned. ¹²Let her not be as one dead, whose flesh is half eaten away when he comes out of his mother's womb."

Romans 8:21 (ESV) ²¹that the <u>creation itself</u> will be set free from its <u>bondage to corruption</u> and obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God.

1 Corinthians 15:50–51 (ESV) ⁵⁰I tell you this, brothers: <u>flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God</u>, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable. ⁵¹Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed,
