Bible Recap: Numbers 17:1 June 11, 2023

## Life Principle: Dissatisfaction With How The Lord Has Directed Your Life Circumstances Can Be Very Dangerous.

1 Corinthians 10:8–11 (ESV) <sup>8</sup>We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. <sup>9</sup>We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents, <sup>10</sup>nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by the Destroyer. <sup>11</sup>Now these things happened to them <u>as an example</u>, but they were <u>written</u> down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come.

James 5:9 (ESV) 9Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the <u>Judge is standing at the door</u>. (Glory Cloud At Entrance Of The Tabernacle.)

Numbers 17:1–5, 8 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup>"Speak to the people of Israel, and get from them staffs, one for each fathers' house, from all their chiefs according to their fathers' houses, twelve staffs. Write each man's name on his staff, <sup>3</sup>and write Aaron's name on the staff of Levi. For there shall be one staff for the head of each fathers' house. <sup>4</sup>Then you shall deposit them in the tent of meeting before the testimony, where I meet with you. <sup>5</sup>And the staff of the man whom I choose shall sprout. Thus I will make to cease from me the grumblings of the people of Israel, which they grumble against you."..... <sup>8</sup>On the next day Moses went into the tent of the testimony, and behold, the staff of Aaron for the house of Levi had sprouted and put forth buds and produced blossoms, and it bore ripe almonds.

## Life Principle: God Affirms His Chosen And Authoritative High Priest By Bringing Life From Death.

Romans 1:3–4 (ESV) <sup>3</sup>concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh <sup>4</sup>and was <u>declared to be the Son</u> of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord,

Psalm 2:7, 10-12. (ESV) <sup>7</sup>I will tell of the decree: The Lord said to me, "<u>You are my Son; today I have begotten you</u>..... <sup>10</sup>Now therefore, O kings, be wise; <u>be warned</u>, O rulers of the earth. <sup>11</sup>Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice with trembling. <sup>12</sup>Kiss the <u>Son</u>, lest he be angry, and you perish in the way, for his wrath is quickly kindled. <u>Blessed are all who take refuge in him.</u>

Numbers 19:1–3 (ESV) ¹Now the Lord spoke to Moses and to Aaron, saying, ²"This is the statute of the law that the Lord has commanded: Tell the people of Israel to bring you a red heifer without defect, in which there is no blemish, and on which a yoke has never come. ³And you shall give it to Eleazar the priest, and it shall be taken outside the camp and slaughtered before him.... 6And the priest shall take cedarwood and hyssop and scarlet yarn, and throw them into the fire burning the heifer..... 9And a man who is clean shall gather up the ashes of the heifer and deposit them outside the camp in a clean place. And they shall be kept for the water for impurity for the congregation of the people of Israel; it is a sin offering.

## Life Principle: God Has Provided A Remedy For Every Negative Impact Of Sin.

1 John 1:9 (ESV) <sup>9</sup>If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Psalm 51:7 (ESV) <sup>7</sup>Purge me with hyssop, and <u>I shall be clean</u>; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Hebrews 9:13–14 (ESV) <sup>13</sup>For if the blood of goats and bulls, and the sprinkling of defiled persons with the <u>ashes of a heifer</u>, sanctify for the <u>purification of the flesh</u>, <sup>14</sup>how much more will the blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without blemish to God, <u>purify our conscience from dead works</u> to serve the living God.

Hebrews 10:21–22 (ESV) <sup>21</sup> and since we have a great priest over the house of God, <sup>22</sup> let us draw near with a true heart in <u>full</u> <u>assurance</u> of faith, with our <u>hearts sprinkled clean</u> from an evil conscience and our <u>bodies washed with pure water</u>.

Numbers 20:2–3, 7-12 (ESV) <sup>2</sup>Now there was no water for the congregation. And they assembled themselves together against Moses and against Aaron. <sup>3</sup>And the people quarreled with Moses and said, "Would that we had perished when our brothers perished before the Lord!...... <sup>7</sup>and the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>8</sup>"Take the staff, and assemble the congregation, you and Aaron your brother, and <u>tell</u> the rock before their eyes to yield its water. So you shall bring water out of the rock for them and give drink to the congregation and their cattle." <sup>9</sup>And Moses took the staff from before the Lord, as he commanded him. <sup>10</sup>Then Moses and Aaron gathered the assembly together before the rock, and he said to them, "Hear now, you rebels: shall we bring water for you out of this rock?" <sup>11</sup>And Moses lifted up his hand and <u>struck the rock</u> with his staff twice, and water came out

abundantly, and the congregation drank, and their livestock. <sup>12</sup>And the Lord said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you did not believe in me, to uphold me as holy in the eyes of the people of Israel, therefore <u>you shall not bring this assembly into the land that I have given them."</u>

Life Principle: The Stresses And Pressures Of Difficult People And Difficult Circumstances Do Not Exempt Us From The Consequences Of Disobedience.

1 Corinthians 10:4 (ESV) <sup>4</sup>and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ.

Numbers 21:4–9 (ESV) <sup>4</sup>From Mount Hor they set out by the way to the Red Sea, to go around the land of Edom. And the people became impatient on the way. <sup>5</sup>And the people spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we loathe this worthless food." <sup>6</sup>Then the Lord sent fiery serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many people of Israel died. <sup>7</sup>And the people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned, for we have spoken against the Lord and against you. Pray to the Lord, that he take away the serpents from us." So Moses prayed for the people. <sup>8</sup>And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a fiery serpent and set it on a pole, and everyone who is bitten, when he sees it, shall live." <sup>9</sup>So Moses made a bronze serpent and set it on a pole. And if a serpent bit anyone, he would look at the bronze serpent and live.

Life Principle: Impatience With The Lord's Timing Can Lead To A Sinful Attitude And Complaining That The Lord Will Judge.

Psalm 40:1 (ESV) 1 waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry.

Romans 12:12 (ESV) <sup>12</sup>Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.

James 5:7–8 (ESV) <sup>7</sup>Be <u>patient</u>, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, <u>being patient about it</u>, until it receives the early and the late rains. <sup>8</sup>You also, <u>be patient</u>. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

John 3:14–15 (ESV) <sup>14</sup>And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, <sup>15</sup>that whoever believes in him may have eternal life.

Numbers 22:1–6 (ESV) ¹Then the people of Israel set out and camped in the plains of Moab beyond the Jordan at Jericho. ²And Balak the son of Zippor saw all that Israel had done to the Amorites. ³And Moab was in great dread of the people, because they were many. Moab was overcome with fear of the people of Israel. ⁴And Moab said to the elders of Midian, "This horde will now lick up all that is around us, as the ox licks up the grass of the field." So Balak the son of Zippor, who was king of Moab at that time, ⁵sent messengers to Balaam the son of Beor at Pethor, which is near the River in the land of the people of Amaw, to call him, saying, "Behold, a people has come out of Egypt. They cover the face of the earth, and they are dwelling opposite me. ⁶Come now, curse this people for me, since they are too mighty for me. Perhaps I shall be able to defeat them and drive them from the land, for I know that he whom you bless is blessed, and he whom you curse is cursed."

## Life Lesson: Balaam Is A Typical Example Of The Characteristics And Motivations Of False Prophets Of The Lord.

2 Peter 2:15–16 (ESV) <sup>15</sup>Forsaking the right way, they have gone astray. They have followed the <u>way of Balaam</u>, the son of Beor, who <u>loved gain from wrongdoing</u>, <sup>16</sup>but was rebuked for his own transgression; a speechless donkey spoke with human voice and restrained the prophet's madness.

Jude 11 (ESV) <sup>11</sup>Woe to them! For they walked in the way of Cain and <u>abandoned themselves for the sake of gain to Balaam's</u> error and perished in Korah's rebellion.

Revelation 2:14 (ESV) <sup>14</sup>But I have a few things against you: you have some there who hold the <u>teaching of Balaam</u>, who taught Balak to put a stumbling block before the sons of Israel, so that they might <u>eat food sacrificed to idols and practice sexual immorality.</u>
