Numbers 6:1–6 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>And the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup>"Speak to the people of Israel and say to them, When either a man or a woman makes a special vow, the vow of a Nazirite, to separate himself to the Lord, <sup>3</sup>he shall separate himself from wine and strong drink. He shall drink no vinegar made from wine or strong drink and shall not drink any juice of grapes or eat grapes, fresh or dried. <sup>4</sup>All the days of his separation he shall eat nothing that is produced by the grapevine, not even the seeds or the skins. <sup>5</sup>"All the days of his vow of separation, no razor shall touch his head. Until the time is completed for which he separates himself to the Lord, he shall be holy. He shall let the locks of hair of his head grow long. <sup>6</sup>"All the days that he separates himself to the Lord he shall not go near a dead body.

## Life Principle: The Nazirite Vow Is A Picture Of Times Of Special Dedication To The Lord.

Jeremiah 7:29 (ESV) <sup>29</sup>" 'Cut off your hair (Nezer) and cast it away; raise a lamentation on the bare heights, for the Lord has rejected and forsaken the generation of his wrath.'

Matthew 8:21–22 (ESV) <sup>21</sup>Another of the disciples said to him, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." <sup>22</sup>And Jesus said to him, "Follow me, and leave the dead to bury their own dead."

Numbers 6:22–26 (ESV) <sup>22</sup>The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>23</sup>"Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, Thus you shall bless the people of Israel: you shall say to them, <sup>24</sup>The Lord bless you and keep you; <sup>25</sup>the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; <sup>26</sup>the Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you peace.

## Life Principle: Spiritual Leaders Should Regularly Encourage God's People By Reminding Them Of God's Favor On Their Lives.

Romans 8:38–39 (ESV) <sup>38</sup>For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, <sup>39</sup>nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

2 Timothy 4:18 (ESV) <sup>18</sup>The Lord will rescue me from every evil deed and bring me safely into his heavenly kingdom. To him be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Numbers 8:1–2 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>Now the Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup>"Speak to Aaron and say to him, When you set up the lamps, the seven lamps shall give light <u>in front of the lampstand</u>."

Numbers 7:1–5 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>On the day when Moses had finished setting up the tabernacle and had anointed and consecrated it with all its furnishings and had anointed and consecrated the altar with all its utensils, <sup>2</sup>the chiefs of Israel, heads of their fathers' houses, who were the chiefs of the tribes, who were over those who were listed, approached <sup>3</sup>and brought their offerings before the Lord, six wagons and twelve oxen, a wagon for every two of the chiefs, and for each one an ox. They brought them before the tabernacle. <sup>4</sup>Then the Lord said to Moses, <sup>5</sup>"Accept these from them, that they may be <u>used in the service of the tent of meeting</u>, and give them to the Levites, to each man according to his service."

## Life Principle: The Ministry Of The Lord And The Ministers Of The Lord Are To Be Materially Supported By The People Of The Lord.

Exodus 36:3–5 (ESV) <sup>3</sup>And they received from Moses all <u>the contribution that the people of Israel had brought for doing the work</u> <u>on the sanctuary</u>. They <u>still kept bringing</u> him freewill offerings every morning, <sup>4</sup>so that all the craftsmen who were doing every sort of task on the sanctuary came, each from the task that he was doing, <sup>5</sup>and said to Moses, "The <u>people bring much more than</u> <u>enough</u> for doing the work that the Lord has commanded us to do."

1 Corinthians 9:14 (ESV) <sup>14</sup>In the same way, the Lord commanded that those who proclaim the gospel should get their living by the gospel.

1 Timothy 5:17–18 (ESV) <sup>17</sup>Let the elders who rule well be considered worthy of double honor, especially those who labor in preaching and teaching. <sup>18</sup>For the Scripture says, "You shall not muzzle an ox when it treads out the grain," and, "The laborer deserves his wages."

2 Corinthians 9:7 (ESV) <sup>7</sup>Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Philippians 4:15–16 (ESV) <sup>15</sup>And you Philippians yourselves know that in the beginning of the gospel, when I left Macedonia, no church entered into partnership with me in giving and receiving, except you only. <sup>16</sup>Even in Thessalonica you sent me help for my needs once and again.

Numbers 9:15–19 (ESV) <sup>15</sup>On the day that the tabernacle was set up, the cloud covered the tabernacle, the tent of the testimony. And at evening it was over the tabernacle like the appearance of fire until morning. <sup>16</sup>So it was always: the cloud covered it by day and the appearance of fire by night. <sup>17</sup>And whenever the cloud lifted from over the tent, after that the people of Israel set out, and in the place where the cloud settled down, there the people of Israel camped. <sup>18</sup>At the command of the Lord the people of Israel set out, and at the command of the Lord they camped. As long as the cloud rested over the tabernacle, they remained in camp. <sup>19</sup>Even when the cloud continued over the tabernacle many days, the people of Israel kept the charge of the Lord and did not set out.

Numbers 9:22–23 (ESV) <sup>22</sup>Whether it was two days, or a month, or a longer time, that the cloud continued over the tabernacle, abiding there, the people of Israel remained in camp and did not set out, but when it lifted they set out. <sup>23</sup>At the command of the Lord they camped, and at the command of the Lord they set out. They kept the charge of the Lord, at the command of the Lord by Moses.

## Life Principle: God's People Should Trust God's Direction And Timing.

Matthew 11:2–6 (ESV) <sup>2</sup>Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples <sup>3</sup>and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?" <sup>4</sup>And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: <sup>5</sup>the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. <sup>6</sup>And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."

John 21:18–21 (ESV) <sup>18</sup>Truly, truly, I say to you, when you were young, you used to dress yourself and walk wherever you wanted, but when you are old, you will stretch out your hands, and another will dress you and carry you where you do not want to go." <sup>19</sup>(This he said to show by what kind of death he was to glorify God.) And after saying this he said to him, "Follow me." <sup>20</sup>Peter turned and saw the disciple whom Jesus loved following them, the one who also had leaned back against him during the supper and had said, "Lord, who is it that is going to betray you?" <sup>21</sup>When Peter saw him, he said to Jesus, "<u>Lord, what about this man</u>?"

Numbers 10:1–2 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>The Lord spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup>"Make two silver trumpets. Of hammered work you shall make them, and you shall use them for summoning the congregation and for breaking camp.

Life Principle: Trumpets In The Bible Typically Represent A Loud And Clear Divine Voice Or Message.

Isaiah 58:1 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>"Cry aloud; do not hold back; <u>lift up your voice like a trumpet</u>; declare to my people their transgression, to the house of Jacob their sins.

Ezekiel 33:4–5 (ESV) <sup>4</sup>then if anyone who hears the sound of the trumpet does not take warning, and the sword comes and takes him away, his blood shall be upon his own head. <sup>5</sup>He <u>heard the sound of the trumpet and did not take warning</u>; his blood shall be upon himself. But if he had taken warning, he would have saved his life.

Joel 2:1 (ESV) <sup>1</sup>Blow a trumpet in Zion; sound an alarm on my holy mountain! Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming; it is near,

Matthew 24:31 (ESV) <sup>31</sup>And he will send out his angels with a loud trumpet call, and they will gather his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.

1 Corinthians 15:51–52 (ESV) <sup>51</sup>Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, <sup>52</sup>in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed.
