Genesis 46:1–7 (ESV) ¹So Israel took his journey with all that he had and <u>came to Beersheba</u>, and <u>offered sacrifices to</u> <u>the God of his father Isaac</u>. ²And God spoke to Israel in visions of the night and said, "Jacob, Jacob." And he said, "Here I am." ³Then he said, "I am God, the God of your father. Do not be afraid to go down to Egypt, for there I will make you into a great nation. ⁴I myself will go down with you to Egypt, and I will also bring you up again, and Joseph's hand shall close your eyes." ⁵Then Jacob set out from Beersheba. The sons of Israel carried Jacob their father, their little ones, and their wives, in the wagons that Pharaoh had sent to carry him. ⁶They also took their livestock and their goods, which they had gained in the land of Canaan, and came into Egypt, Jacob and all his offspring with him, ⁷his sons, and his sons' sons with him, his daughters, and his sons' daughters. All his offspring he brought with him into Egypt.

Life Principle: Positive Spiritual Growth Is Demonstrated By A Person Truly Seeking God's Guidance Before Making Major Life Decisions.

Luke 6:12–13 (ESV) ¹²In these days he went out to the mountain to pray, and all night he continued in prayer to God. ¹³And when day came, he called his disciples and chose from them twelve, whom he named apostles:

Genesis 47:27–30 (ESV) ²⁷Thus Israel settled in the land of Egypt, in the land of Goshen. And they <u>gained possessions</u> <u>in it, and were fruitful and multiplied greatly</u>. ²⁸And Jacob <u>lived in the land of Egypt</u> seventeen years. So the days of Jacob, the years of his life, were 147 years. ²⁹And when the time drew near that Israel must die, he called his son Joseph and said to him, "If now I have found favor in your sight, put your hand under my thigh and promise to deal kindly and truly with me. <u>Do not bury me in Egypt</u>, ³⁰but let me lie with my fathers. Carry me out of Egypt and bury me in their burying place." He answered, "I will do as you have said."

Life Principle: Stay Focused On God's Future Promises Even When You Are Prospering In The Present.

Hebrews 11:16 (ESV) ¹⁶But as it is, <u>they desire a better country</u>, that is, <u>a heavenly one</u>. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.

Matthew 6:19–21 (ESV) ¹⁹"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, ²⁰but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Genesis 48:20 (ESV) ²⁰So he blessed them that day, saying, "By you Israel will pronounce blessings, saying, 'God make you as Ephraim and as Manasseh.' " Thus <u>he put Ephraim before Manasseh</u>.

Life Principle: God Does Not Bless According To Human Merit Or The World's Expectations But Behavior And Life Choices Do Matter.

Luke 17:10 (ESV) ¹⁰So you also, when you have done all that you were commanded, say, 'We are <u>unworthy servants</u>; we have only done what was our duty.' "

Ephesians 2:8–9 (ESV) ⁸For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, <u>⁹not a result of works, so that no one may boast</u>.

Romans 11:33–36 (ESV) ³³Oh, the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are his judgments and how <u>inscrutable his ways</u>! ³⁴"For who has known the mind of the Lord, or who has been his counselor?" ³⁵"Or who <u>has given a gift to him that he might be repaid</u>?" ³⁶For from him and through him and to him are all things. <u>To him be glory forever</u>. Amen.

Life Principle: God Does Not Bless According To Human Merit Or The World's Expectations But Behavior And Life Choices Do Matter.

Genesis 49:3–10 (ESV) ³"Reuben, you are my firstborn, my might, and the firstfruits of my strength, preeminent in dignity and preeminent in power. ⁴Unstable as water, you shall not have preeminence, <u>because you went up to your father's bed</u>; then you defiled it—he went up to my couch! ⁵"Simeon and Levi are brothers; weapons of violence are their swords. ⁶Let my soul come not into their council; <u>O my glory, be not joined to their company</u>. For in their anger they killed men, and in their willfulness they hamstrung oxen. ⁷Cursed be their anger, for it is fierce, and their wrath, for it is cruel! I will divide them in Jacob and scatter them in Israel. ⁸"Judah, your brothers shall praise you; your hand shall be on the neck of your enemies; your father's sons shall bow down before you. ⁹Judah is a lion's cub; from the prey, my son, you have gone up. He stooped down; he crouched as a lion and as a lioness; who dares rouse him? ¹⁰The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until tribute comes to him; and to him shall be the obedience of the peoples.

Genesis 50:15–21 (ESV) ¹⁵When Joseph's brothers saw that their father was dead, they said, <u>"It may be that Joseph</u> will hate us and pay us back for all the evil that we did to him." ¹⁶So they sent a message to Joseph, saying, "Your father gave this command before he died: ¹⁷'Say to Joseph, "Please forgive the transgression of your brothers and their sin, because they did evil to you." ' And now, please forgive the transgression of the servants of the God of your father." Joseph wept when they spoke to him. ¹⁸His brothers also came and fell down before him and said, "Behold, we are your servants." ¹⁹But Joseph said to them, "Do not fear, for am I in the place of God? ²⁰As for you, <u>you meant evil against me</u>, but God meant it for good, to bring it about that many people should be kept alive, as they are today. ²¹So do not fear; I will provide for you and your little ones." Thus he comforted them and spoke kindly to them.

Luke 6:27–28 (ESV) ²⁷"But I say to you who hear, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, ²⁸bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you.

Luke 6:32–33 (ESV) ³²"If you love those who love you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. ³³And if you do good to those who do good to you, what benefit is that to you? For even sinners do the same.

Life Principle: Christians Should Remember That Any Type Of Revenge Or Payback Is Intruding On God's Prerogative

Romans 12:19-21 (ESV) 19 <u>Do not take revenge</u>, my friends, but <u>leave room for God's wrath</u>, for it is written: "<u>It is</u> <u>mine to avenge</u>; I will repay</u>," says the Lord. 20 On the contrary: "If your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink. In doing this, you will heap burning coals on his head." 21 Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

1 Peter 2:21-23 (ESV) To this you were called, because Christ suffered for you, <u>leaving you an example, that you</u> <u>should follow</u> in his steps. 22 "He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth." 23 When they hurled their insults at him, <u>he did not retaliate</u>; when he suffered, h<u>e made no threats</u>. Instead, <u>he entrusted himself to him</u> <u>who judges justly</u>.

Life Principle: It Is Essential That Christians Understand And Believe That Even The Worst Circumstances Are Used By God For The Best Purposes.

Daniel 2:21–22 (NLT) ²¹He controls the course of world events; he removes kings and sets up other kings. He gives wisdom to the wise and knowledge to the scholars. ²²He reveals deep and mysterious things and knows what lies hidden in darkness, though he is surrounded by light.

Romans 8:28 (ESV) ²⁸And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.
