Exodus 8:18–19 (ESV) ¹⁸The magicians tried by their secret arts to produce gnats, but they could not. So there were gnats on man and beast. ¹⁹Then the magicians said to Pharaoh, "<u>This is the finger of God</u>." But <u>Pharaoh's heart was hardened</u>, and he would not listen to them, as the Lord had said.

Exodus 8:22–23 (ESV) ²²But on that day <u>I will set apart the land of Goshen</u>, where my people dwell, so that no swarms of flies shall be there, <u>that you may know that I am the Lord</u> in the midst of the earth. ²³Thus <u>I</u> will put a division between my people and your people. Tomorrow this sign shall happen." ' "

Exodus 8:25 (ESV) ²⁵Then Pharaoh called Moses and Aaron and said, "Go, sacrifice to your God <u>within the</u> <u>land</u>."

Exodus 8:28–29 (ESV) ²⁸So Pharaoh said, "I will let you go to sacrifice to the Lord your God in the wilderness; only you must not go very far away. <u>Plead for me</u>." ²⁹Then Moses said, "Behold, I am going out from you and <u>I will plead with the Lord</u> that the swarms of flies may depart from Pharaoh, from his servants, and from his people, tomorrow. <u>Only let not Pharaoh cheat again by not letting the people go to sacrifice to the Lord."</u>

Life Principle: God Listens To The Prayers Of Righteous People Pleading For The Wicked.

Psalm 106:23 (NLT) ²³So he declared he would destroy them. But Moses, his chosen one, <u>stepped between</u> <u>the Lord and the people</u>. He begged him to turn from his anger and not destroy them.

James 5:16b–18 (ESV) ...The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. ¹⁷Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. ¹⁸Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit.

Ezekiel 14:12–14 (ESV) ¹²And the word of the Lord came to me: ¹³"Son of man, when a land sins against me by acting faithlessly, and I stretch out my hand against it and break its supply of bread and send famine upon it, and cut off from it man and beast, ¹⁴even if these three men, Noah, Daniel, and Job, were in it, they would deliver but their own lives by their righteousness, declares the Lord God.

Exodus 8:32 (ESV) ³²But <u>Pharaoh hardened his heart this time also</u>, and did not let the people go.

Exodus 9:6–7 (ESV) ⁶And the next day the Lord did this thing. All the livestock of the Egyptians died, but not one of the livestock of the people of Israel died. ⁷And Pharaoh sent, and behold, not one of the livestock of Israel was dead. But the <u>heart of Pharaoh was hardened</u>, and he did not let the people go.

Exodus 9:11–12 (ESV) ¹¹And the magicians could not stand before Moses because of the boils, for the boils came upon the magicians and upon all the Egyptians. ¹²But <u>the Lord hardened the heart of Pharaoh</u>, and he did not listen to them, as the Lord had spoken to Moses.

Life Principle: People Who Stubbornly Refuse To Yield To God May Have Their Hearts Hardened Even More.

Hebrews 3:7–8 (ESV) ⁷Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says, "Today, if you hear his voice, <u>8do not harden your</u> <u>hearts</u> as in the rebellion, on the day of testing in the wilderness,

Revelation 16:9 (ESV) ⁹They were scorched by the fierce heat, and <u>they cursed the name of God</u> who had power over these plagues. <u>They did not repent</u> and give him glory.

Exodus 9:18–21 (ESV) ¹⁸Behold, about this time tomorrow I will cause very heavy hail to fall, such as never has been in Egypt from the day it was founded until now. ¹⁹Now therefore send, get your livestock and all that you have in the field into safe shelter, for every man and beast that is in the field and is not brought home will die when the hail falls on them." '" ²⁰Then <u>whoever feared the word of the Lord among the servants of Pharaoh hurried his slaves and his livestock into the houses, ²¹but whoever did not pay attention to the word of the Lord left his slaves and his livestock in the field.</u>

Life Principle: Those Who Take God's Warnings Seriously Will Be Blessed.

2 Peter 3:3–4 (ESV) ³knowing this first of all, that scoffers will come in the last days with scoffing, following their own sinful desires. ⁴They will say, "Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things are continuing as they were from the beginning of creation."

Exodus 9:34 (ESV) ³⁴But <u>when Pharaoh saw that the rain and the hail and the thunder had ceased, he</u> <u>sinned yet again</u> and <u>hardened his heart</u>, he and his servants.

Exodus 10:3–5 (ESV) ³So Moses and Aaron went in to Pharaoh and said to him, "Thus says the Lord, the God of the Hebrews, '<u>How long will you refuse to humble yourself before me</u>? Let my people go, that they may serve me. ⁴For if you refuse to let my people go, behold, tomorrow I will bring locusts into your country, ⁵and they shall cover the face of the land, so that no one can see the land. And they shall eat what is left to you after the hail, and they shall eat every tree of yours that grows in the field,

Exodus 10:7 (ESV) ⁷Then Pharaoh's servants said to him, "How long shall this man be a snare to us? Let the men go, that they may serve the Lord their God. Do you not yet understand that Egypt is ruined?"

Life Principle: Foolish People Will Stubbornly Refuse To Obey God Even When It's Obvious They Are Hurting Themselves And Those Around Them.

Isaiah 1:5-6 (ESV) Why will you still be struck down? <u>Why will you continue to rebel?</u> The whole head is sick, and the whole heart faint.⁶ From the sole of the foot even to the head, there is no soundness in it, but bruises and sores and raw wounds; they are not pressed out or bound up or softened with oil.

Proverbs 29:1 (ESV) ¹He who is often reproved, yet stiffens his neck, will suddenly be broken beyond healing.

Exodus 10:16–17 (ESV) ¹⁶Then Pharaoh hastily called Moses and Aaron and said, "I have sinned against the Lord your God, and against you. ¹⁷Now therefore, <u>forgive my sin, please, only this once</u>, and plead with the Lord your God only to remove this death from me."

Exodus 10:21–23 (ESV) ²¹Then the Lord said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand toward heaven, that there may be darkness over the land of Egypt, a darkness to be felt." ²²So Moses stretched out his hand toward heaven, and there was pitch darkness in all the land of Egypt three days. ²³They did not see one another, nor did anyone rise from his place for three days, but all the people of Israel had light where they lived.

Revelation 16:10–11 (ESV) ¹⁰The fifth angel poured out his bowl on the throne of the beast, and its kingdom was plunged into darkness. People gnawed their tongues in anguish ¹¹and cursed the God of heaven for their pain and sores. They did not repent of their deeds.

Exodus 11:1 (ESV) ¹The Lord said to Moses, "Yet <u>one plague more</u> I will bring upon Pharaoh and upon Egypt. Afterward he will let you go from here. When he lets you go, he will drive you away completely.

Life Principle: Lesser Judgments Are Preludes To The Great Judgment Day To Come.

Exodus 11:2 (ESV) ²Speak now in the hearing of the people, that they ask, every man of his neighbor and every woman of her neighbor, for silver and gold jewelry."

Exodus 12:1–13 (ESV) The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, ² "This month shall be for you the beginning of months. It shall be the first month of the year for you. ³ Tell all the congregation of Israel that on the tenth day of this month every man shall take a lamb according to their fathers' houses, a lamb for a household. ⁴ And if the household is too small for a lamb, then he and his nearest neighbor shall take according to the number of persons; according to what each can eat you shall make your count for the lamb. ⁵ Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male a year old. You may take it from the sheep or from the goats, ⁶ and you shall keep it until the fourteenth day of this month, when the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill their lambs at twilight. ⁷ "Then they shall take some of the blood and put it on the two doorposts and the lintel of the houses in which they eat it. ⁸ They shall eat the flesh that night, roasted on the fire; with unleavened bread and bitter herbs they shall eat it. ⁹ Do not eat any of it raw or boiled in water, but roasted, its head with its legs and its inner parts. ¹⁰ And you shall let none of it remain until the morning; anything that remains until the morning you shall burn. ¹¹ In this manner you shall eat it: with your belt fastened, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand. And you shall eat it in haste. It is the Lord's Passover. ¹² For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord. ¹³ The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt.

Life Principle: The Various Aspects Of The Passover Event Are Pictures Of Our Salvation Today.

1 Corinthians 5:7 (ESV) ⁷Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed.

John 1:29 (ESV) ²⁹The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!

1 Peter 1:19 (ESV) (You were redeemed) with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot.

Hebrews 11:28 (ESV) ²⁸By faith he kept the Passover and sprinkled the blood, so that the Destroyer of the firstborn might not touch them.
