Joshua 10:5–14 (ESV) <sup>5</sup>Then the five kings of the Amorites, the king of Jerusalem, the king of Hebron, the king of Jarmuth, the king of Lachish, and the king of Eglon, gathered their forces and went up with all their armies and encamped against Gibeon and made war against it. <sup>6</sup> And the men of Gibeon sent to Joshua at the camp in Gilgal, saying, "Do not relax your hand from your servants. Come up to us quickly and save us and help us, for all the kings of the Amorites who dwell in the hill country are gathered against us." <sup>7</sup> So Joshua went up from Gilgal, he and all the people of war with him, and all the mighty men of valor. <sup>8</sup> And the Lord said to Joshua, "Do not fear them, for I have given them into your hands. Not a man of them shall stand before you." <sup>9</sup>So Joshua came upon them suddenly, having marched up all night from Gilgal. <sup>10</sup> And the Lord threw them into a panic before Israel, who struck them with a great blow at Gibeon and chased them by the way of the ascent of Beth-horon and struck them as far as Azekah and Makkedah. <sup>11</sup> And as they fled before Israel, while they were going down the ascent of Beth-horon, the Lord threw down large stones from heaven on them as far as Azekah, and they died. There were more who died because of the hailstones than the sons of Israel killed with the sword. <sup>12</sup> At that time Joshua spoke to the Lord in the day when the Lord gave the Amorites over to the sons of Israel, and he said in the sight of Israel, "Sun, stand still at Gibeon, and moon, in the Valley of Aijalon." <sup>13</sup> And the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, until the nation took vengeance on their enemies. Is this not written in the Book of Jashar? The sun stopped in the midst of heaven and did not hurry to set for about a whole day. <sup>14</sup> There has been no day like it before or since, when the Lord heeded the voice of a man, for the Lord fought for Israel.

Life Principle: God's People Should Never Give Up Or Give In On Obeying God Fully Because God Fights With Us And For Us.

Romans 8:2, 12 (ESV) For the law (power) of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law (power) of sin and death.... So then brothers, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh.

Philippians 2:12–13 (ESV) <sup>12</sup> Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, <sup>13</sup> for it is <u>God who works in you</u>, <u>both to will and to work for his good pleasure</u>.

1 Timothy 6:11–12 (ESV) <sup>11</sup> But as for you, O man of God, flee these things. Pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, gentleness. <sup>12</sup> Fight the good fight of the faith. Take hold of the eternal life to which you were called and about which you made the good confession in the presence of many witnesses.

Joshua 10:42 (ESV) <sup>42</sup>And Joshua captured all these kings and their land at one time, because the Lord God of Israel fought for Israel.

Number 33:55 (ESV) But if you do not drive out the inhabitants of the land from before you, then those of them whom you let remain shall be as barbs in your eyes and thorns in your sides, and they shall trouble you in the land where you dwell.

Joshua 10:40 (ESV) <sup>40</sup> So Joshua struck the whole land, the hill country and the Negeb and the lowland and the slopes, and all their kings. <u>He left none remaining</u>, but devoted to destruction all that breathed, just as the Lord God of Israel <u>commanded</u>.

Joshua 11:18 (ESV) <sup>18</sup> Joshua made war a long time with all those kings.

Joshua 22:10–12 (ESV) <sup>10</sup> And when they came to the region of the Jordan that is in the land of Canaan, the people of Reuben and the people of Gad and the half-tribe of Manasseh built there an altar by the Jordan, an altar of imposing size. <sup>11</sup> And the people of Israel heard it said, "Behold, the people of Reuben and the people of Gad and the half-tribe of Manasseh have built the altar at the frontier of the land of Canaan, in the region about the Jordan, on the side that

belongs to the people of Israel." <sup>12</sup> And when the people of Israel heard of it, the whole assembly of the people of Israel gathered at Shiloh to make war against them.

Joshua 22:16–18 (ESV) <sup>16</sup> "Thus says the whole congregation of the Lord, 'What is this breach of faith that you have committed against the God of Israel in turning away this day from following the Lord by building yourselves an altar this day in rebellion against the Lord? <sup>17</sup> Have we not had enough of the sin at Peor from which even yet we have not cleansed ourselves, and for which there came a plague upon the congregation of the Lord, <sup>18</sup> that you too must turn away this day from following the Lord? And if you too rebel against the Lord today then tomorrow he will be angry with the whole congregation of Israel.

Joshua 22:21–24, 33 (ESV) <sup>21</sup> Then the people of Reuben, the people of Gad, and the half-tribe of Manasseh said in answer to the heads of the families of Israel, <sup>22</sup> "The Mighty One, God, the Lord! The Mighty One, God, the Lord! He knows; and let Israel itself know! If it was in rebellion or in breach of faith against the Lord, do not spare us today <sup>23</sup> for building an altar to turn away from following the Lord. Or if we did so to offer burnt offerings or grain offerings or peace offerings on it, may the Lord himself take vengeance. <sup>24</sup> No, but we did it from fear that in time to come your children might say to our children, 'What have you to do with the Lord, the God of Israel?.... <sup>33</sup>And the report was good in the eyes of the people of Israel. And the people of Israel blessed God and spoke no more of making war against them to destroy the land where the people of Reuben and the people of Gad were settled.

Life Principle: God's People Have The Responsibility To Deal With Spiritual Or Moral Departure In Other Believers, But They Must Do So Righteously.

Titus 1:9 (ESV) He (Spiritual Leaders) must hold firm to the trustworthy word as taught, so that he may be able to give instruction in sound doctrine and <u>also to rebuke those who contradict it.</u>

Jude 3 (ESV) Beloved, although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to <u>contend for the faith</u> that was once for all delivered to the saints. 1 Corinthians 5:6 (ESV) Your boasting is not good. Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump?

Proverbs 18:13 (ESV) If one gives an answer before he hears, it is his folly and shame.

Joshua 23:1–8 (ESV) A long time afterward, when <u>the Lord had given rest to Israel</u> from all their surrounding enemies, and Joshua was old and well advanced in years, <sup>2</sup> Joshua summoned all Israel, its elders and heads, its judges and officers, and said to them, "I am now old and well advanced in years. <sup>3</sup> And you have seen all that the Lord your God has done to all these nations for your sake, for it is <u>the Lord your God who has fought for you</u>. <sup>4</sup> Behold, I have allotted to you as an inheritance for your tribes those nations that remain, along with all the nations that I have already cut off, from the Jordan to the Great Sea in the west. <sup>5</sup> <u>The Lord your God will push them back before you and drive them out of your sight. And you shall possess their land, just as the Lord your God promised you</u>. <sup>6</sup> Therefore, be very strong to keep and to do all that is written in the Book of the Law of Moses, <u>turning aside from it neither to the right hand nor to the left</u>, <sup>7</sup> that you may not mix with these nations remaining among you or make mention of the names of their gods or swear by them or serve them or bow down to them, <sup>8</sup> but <u>you shall cling to the Lord your God</u> just as you have done to this day.

Life Principle: Genuine Loyalty To The Lord Will Be Tested And Proven By Our Actions.

Joshua 24:13–15 (ESV) <sup>13</sup> I gave you a land on which you had not labored and cities that you had not built, and you dwell in them. You eat the fruit of vineyards and olive orchards that you did not plant.' <sup>14</sup> "Now therefore fear the Lord and serve him in sincerity and in faithfulness. Put away the gods that your fathers served beyond the River and in Egypt, and serve the Lord. <sup>15</sup>And if it is evil in your eyes to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell. But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."
