Bible Recap 2 Samuel: 2 Samuel 1:11 March 10, 2024.

2 Samuel 1:11–12, 15 (ESV) <sup>11</sup>Then David took hold of his clothes and tore them, and so did all the men who were with him. <sup>12</sup> And they <u>mourned and wept and fasted</u> until evening for Saul and for Jonathan his son and for the people of the Lord and for the house of Israel, because they had fallen by the sword..... <sup>15</sup>Then David called one of the young men and said, "Go, execute him." And <u>he struck him down so that he died.</u>

Life Principle: We Should Not Take Any Pleasure In The Downfall Of The Wicked.

2 Samuel 2:4–6 (ESV) <sup>4</sup> And the men of Judah came, and there they anointed David king over the house of Judah. When they told David, "It was the men of Jabesh-gilead who buried Saul," <sup>5</sup> David sent messengers to the men of Jabesh-gilead and said to them, "May you be blessed by the Lord, because you showed this loyalty to Saul your lord and buried him. <sup>6</sup> Now may the Lord show steadfast love and faithfulness to you. And I will do good to you because you have done this thing.

2 Samuel 3:31 (ESV) <sup>31</sup> Then David said to Joab and to all the people who were with him, "Tear your clothes and put on sackcloth and mourn before Abner." And King David followed the bier.

2 Samuel 4:9–11 (ESV) <sup>9</sup> But David answered Rechab and Baanah his brother, the sons of Rimmon the Beerothite, "As the Lord lives, who has redeemed my life out of every adversity, <sup>10</sup> when one told me, 'Behold, Saul is dead,' and thought he was bringing good news, I seized him and killed him at Ziklag, which was the reward I gave him for his news. <sup>11</sup> How much more, when wicked men have killed a righteous man (Ish-bosheth) in his own house on his bed, shall I not now require his blood at your hand and destroy you from the earth?"

Ezekiel 18:23 (ESV)<sup>23</sup>Have I any pleasure in the death of the wicked, declares the Lord God, and not rather that he should turn from his way and live?

1 Corinthians 13:6 (ESV) <sup>6</sup>it (Love) does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth.

2 Samuel 5:12 (ESV) <sup>12</sup>And <u>David knew that the Lord had established him king</u> over Israel, and that he had exalted his kingdom <u>for the sake of his people Israel.</u>

Life Principle: We Are Blessed In Order To Be A Blessing To God And Others.

Acts 20:35 (ESV) <sup>35</sup>In all things I have shown you (Ephesian Elders) that by working hard in this way <u>we must</u> <u>help the weak</u> and <u>remember the words of the Lord Jesus</u>, how he himself said, '<u>It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"</u>

Numbers 4:15 (ESV) <sup>15</sup>And when Aaron and his sons have finished covering the sanctuary and all the furnishings of the sanctuary, as the camp sets out, after that the sons of Kohath shall come to <u>carry these</u>, but <u>they must not touch the holy things</u>, <u>lest they die</u>. These are the things of the tent of meeting that the sons of Kohath are to carry.

Numbers 7:9 (ESV) <sup>9</sup>But to the sons of Kohath he gave none, because they were charged with the service of the holy things that had to be carried on the shoulder.

2 Samuel 6:1–7 (ESV) David again gathered all the chosen men of Israel, thirty thousand. <sup>2</sup> And David arose and went with all the people who were with him from Baale-judah to bring up from there the ark of God, which is called by the name of the Lord of hosts who sits enthroned on the cherubim. <sup>3</sup> And they carried the ark of God on a new cart and brought it out of the house of Abinadab, which was on the hill. And Uzzah and Ahio, the sons of Abinadab, were driving the new cart, <sup>4</sup> with the ark of God, and Ahio went before the ark. <sup>5</sup> And David and all the house of Israel were celebrating before the Lord, with songs and lyres and harps and tambourines and castanets and cymbals. <sup>6</sup> And when they came to the threshing floor of Nacon, Uzzah <u>put out his hand to the ark of God and took hold of it</u>, for <u>the oxen stumbled</u>. <sup>7</sup> And the anger of the Lord was kindled against Uzzah, and God struck him down there because of his error, and he died there beside the ark of God.

Life Principle: Good Intentions Do Not Make It Okay To Disobey God's Word.

2 Samuel 6:8–13 (ESV) <sup>8</sup> And David was angry because the Lord had broken out against Uzzah. And that place is called Perez-uzzah to this day. <sup>9</sup> And David was afraid of the Lord that day, and he said, "How can the ark of the Lord come to me?" <sup>10</sup> So David was not willing to take the ark of the Lord into the city of David. But David took it aside to the house of Obed-edom the Gittite. <sup>11</sup> And the ark of the Lord remained in the house of Obed-edom the Gittite three months, and the Lord blessed Obed-edom and all his household. <sup>12</sup> And it was told King David, "The Lord has blessed the household of Obed-edom and all that belongs to him, because of the ark of God." So David went and brought up the ark of God from the house of Obed-edom to the city of David with rejoicing. <sup>13</sup> And when those who bore the ark of the Lord had gone six steps, he sacrificed an ox and a fattened animal.

Life Principle: God's Favorable Presence Brings Blessings So We Should Strive For Those Things That Invite His Favorable Presence.

1 Corinthians 6:19–20 (ESV) <sup>19</sup> Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, <sup>20</sup> for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body.

Ephesians 4:30–32 (ESV) <sup>30</sup> And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. <sup>31</sup> Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. <sup>32</sup> Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

2 Samuel 6:14–16, 20-23 (ESV) <sup>14</sup> And David danced before the Lord with all his might. And David was wearing a linen ephod. <sup>15</sup> So David and all the house of Israel brought up the ark of the Lord with shouting and with the sound of the horn. <sup>16</sup> As the ark of the Lord came into the city of David, Michal the daughter of Saul looked out of the window and saw King David leaping and dancing before the Lord, and she despised him in her heart.....
<sup>20</sup> And David returned to bless his household. But Michal the daughter of Saul came out to meet David and said, "How the king of Israel honored himself today, uncovering himself today before the eyes of his servants' female servants, as one of the vulgar fellows shamelessly uncovers himself!" <sup>21</sup> And David said to Michal, "It was before the Lord, who chose me above your father and above all his house, to appoint me as prince over Israel, the people of the Lord—and I will celebrate before the Lord. <sup>22</sup> I will make myself yet more contemptible than this, and I will be abased in your eyes. But by the female servants of whom you have spoken, by them I shall be held in honor." <sup>23</sup> And Michal the daughter of Saul had no child to the day of her death.

Life Principle: The Greater Our Understanding Of God's Goodness To Us, The Greater Our Humility And Gratitude Towards Him.
