Matthew 11:1–6 (ESV) When Jesus had finished instructing his twelve disciples, he went on from there to teach and preach in their cities. ² Now when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples ³ and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or shall we look for another?"⁴ And Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. ⁶ And blessed is the one who is not offended by me."

Life Principle: Spiritual Doubts Can Be A Problem For Even The Most Godly And Committed Follower Of Jesus.

Jude 22 (ESV) ²²And have mercy on those who doubt;

1 Corinthians 13:12 (ESV) ¹²For now <u>we see in a mirror dimly</u>, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known.

Matthew 11:7–14 (ESV) ⁷ As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? ⁸ What then did you go out to see? A man dressed in soft clothing? Behold, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. ⁹ What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰ This is he of whom it is written, " 'Behold, I send my messenger before your face, who will prepare your way before you.' ¹¹ Truly, I say to you, among those born of women there has arisen no one greater than John the Baptist. Yet the one who is least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he. ¹² From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force. ¹³ For all the Prophets and the Law prophesied until John, ¹⁴ and if you are willing to accept it, he is Elijah who is to come.

Life Principle: The Advancement Of The Kingdom Of Jesus Is A Holy Invasion That Evil People Will Resist With Hostility And Force.

Matthew 11:15–19 (ESV) ¹⁵ He who has ears to hear, let him hear. ¹⁶ "But to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the marketplaces and calling to their playmates, ¹⁷ " We played the flute for you, and you did not dance; we sang a dirge, and you did not mourn.' ¹⁸ For John came neither eating nor drinking, and they say, 'He has a demon.' ¹⁹ The Son of Man came eating and drinking, and they say, 'Look at him! A glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' Yet wisdom is justified by her deeds."

Life Principle: Some People Will Always Find An Excuse To Disbelieve Or Reject Spiritual Truth.

Matthew 11:20–24 (ESV) ²⁰ Then he began to denounce the cities where most of his mighty works had been done, because they did not repent. ²¹ "Woe to you, Chorazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Tyre and Sidon, they would have repented long ago in sackcloth and ashes. ²² But I tell you, it will be more bearable on the day of judgment for Tyre and Sidon than for you. ²³ And you, Capernaum, will you be exalted to heaven? You will be brought down to Hades. For if the mighty works done in you had been done in Sodom, it would have remained until this day. ²⁴ But I tell you that it will be more tolerable on the day of judgment for Sodom than for you."

Life Principle: People Who Ignore, Disbelief, Or Reject Spiritual Truth Will Ultimately Be Severely Judged.

Matthew 11:25–27 (ESV) ²⁵ At that time Jesus declared, "I thank you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, that you have hidden these things from the wise and understanding and revealed them to little children; ²⁶ yes, Father, for such was your gracious will. ²⁷ All things have been handed over to me by my Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and anyone to whom the Son chooses to reveal him.

Life Principle: Spiritual Truth Is Divinely Hidden From The Pridefully Self-Confident But Divinely Revealed By Jesus To Those Who Are Humble And Open Like Children.

Matthew 11:25 (NLT.) At that time Jesus prayed this prayer: "O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, thank you for hiding these things from those <u>who think themselves wise and clever</u>...

1 Corinthians 1:19–21 (NLT) ¹⁹As the Scriptures say, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise and discard the intelligence of the intelligent." ²⁰So where does this leave the philosophers, the scholars, and the world's brilliant debaters? God has made the wisdom of this world look foolish. ²¹Since <u>God in his wisdom saw to it that the world would never know him through human wisdom</u>, he has used our foolish preaching to save those who believe.

1 Corinthians 2:9–11 (ESV) ⁹But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him" — ¹⁰these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit. For the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. ¹¹For who knows a person's thoughts except the spirit of that person, which is in him? So also no one comprehends the thoughts of God except the Spirit of God.

Matthew 11:28–30 (ESV) ²⁸ Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. ²⁹ Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. ³⁰ For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light."

Life Principle: Jesus Invites Everyone To A Personal Relationship And Discipleship Commitment To Him So They Can Find Spiritual Rest.

Acts 15:10 (ESV) ¹⁰Now, therefore, why are you putting God to the test by placing a yoke on the neck of the disciples that neither our fathers nor we have been able to bear?
