WARM UP

1. What is your all time favorite Christmas movie and why? (Bonus: Is "Die Hard" a Christmas move? Discuss...)



KNOW IT

- 1. Read **Isaiah 9:1-2.** What stands out to you about God's promise of light breaking into darkness? What does this reveal about God's heart toward hopeless people?
- 2. Read **Isaiah 9:6.** Why do you think the titles Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace were given 700 years before Jesus arrived? What might God want His people to understand in the waiting?
- 2. Without getting too serious what's one area of life where you wish you had a personal counselor on speed dial?
- 3. Jeremiah said, "God cares more about what happens IN us than TO us." Where do you see that truth at work in the story of King Ahaz? Why is this such a difficult principle to accept?
- 4. Isaiah 40:13-15 emphasizes that God does not need anyone's advice. What does this reveal about Jesus being the **Wonderful Counselor**? How is He different from every other counselor or adviser?



SHARE IT

- 1. Think of a time when life felt "dark" or overwhelming. Where did you see God show up maybe not immediately, but eventually?
- 2. King Ahaz trusted what he could SEE rather than what God promised. Where do you personally feel the temptation to "form your own alliance" instead of trusting God?
- 3. "Great counselors teach us HOW to think, not WHAT to think." Has God ever shaped HOW you think about a situation rather than giving you a direct answer? What happened?
- 4. Have you ever known what God wanted you to do, but struggled to apply it? What got in the way?



LIVE IT

- 1. What might it look like this week to intentionally invite Jesus' counsel into your decisions rather than only seeking Him in crisis?
- 2. Identify one teaching of Jesus that feels counter cultural or uncomfortable (forgiveness, humility, generosity, loving enemies, etc.). What is one small step of obedience you can take in that area this week?
- 3. If "a counselor's wisdom is only experienced with applied," what is one specific truth from Scripture you already know but haven't taken action yet? What's your next step?
