COMMIT TO MEMORY:

*For a child is born to us, a son is given to us. The government will rest on his shoulders. And he will be called: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. **Isaiah 9:6***

Wonderful Counselor: The God who GUIDES .

Mighty God: The God who OVERCOMES .

*Who is the King of glory? The Lord, strong and mighty; the Lord, invincible in battle. **Psalm 24:8***

*How great is our Lord! His power is absolute! His understanding is beyond comprehension! **Psalm 147:5***

WARM UP

1. Are you a “real tree” or “fake tree” person - and why is your answer the *correct* one?

2. Christmas tends to **magnify** whatever we’re going through - good or bad. In this season of your life, what is Christmas magnifying for you?

KNOW IT

1. Read **Isaiah 9:6**. What does “Mighty God” communicate about Jesus’ nature and His mission?

2. Read **Psalms 24:8** and **Psalms 147:5**. What do these verses reveal about God’s strength, power, and capability?

3. Read **Luke 4:18-21**. Jesus claims that Isaiah’s prophecy was fulfilled in *Him*. What does this reveal about the kind of people Jesus came for? How does this challenge our assumptions about who “needs God”?

4. Read **Ephesians 3:20-21**. What stands out to you about God’s ability to do “immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine?” How does this shape your understanding of Jesus as *Mighty God*?

SHARE IT

1. What temporary “one thing” do you tend to believe will fix your life (“If I just had _____, things would be better”)?

2. We often trust God easily when someone *else* is going through something difficult - but not when *we* are. When are *you* most tempted to rely on your own strength or strategies instead of trusting God?

3. Jesus said he came for the **poor, captive, blind, and oppressed** - a description of *all humanity*. Which of these four words best describes where you feel weakest right now? Why?

LIVE IT

1. “*God’s power tends to be experienced most by those who acknowledge their own lack of power.*” What is one area where you need to stop pretending you can fix it on your own and ask God for help?

2. Where is God inviting you to trust His **Might**? What is one practical way you can fix your eyes on what is **eternal**, rather than on what is **temporary**?

3. Who in your world needs a reminder of the Mighty God this Christmas? What is one specific way you could encourage or support them?
