The Triumph Of God's Redemption

Romans 11:11-16

Main Idea: *God sovereignly advances His redemptive plan through Israel's present rejection, the salvation of the Gentiles, and the certainty of His covenant promises; all for His Glory.*

Introduction:

- If God has not rejected Israel, then why has He allowed Israel to reject Christ?

God Sovereignly Advances Redemption Through Israel's Rejection - vv. 11-12

- Israel's rejection was not final - **v. 11a**
- Israel's rejection became the means of Salvation for the nations - **v.11b**
- Israel's future restoration displays God's greater Glory - **v.12**

God Sovereignly Accomplishes Redemption Through Gospel Proclamation - vv.13-15

- Paul embraced God's calling - **v.13**
 - **Acts 9:15; 1 Corinthians 4:1-2**
- Paul longed for the salvation of his fellow Jews - **vv.14-15a**
 - **2 Timothy 2:10; Acts 13:48**
- Israel's future acceptance points to greater life - **v.15**

God Sovereignly Guarantees Redemption Through His Covenant Promises - v.16

- Why can Paul be so confident that God's redemptive plan will not fail?
 - God's covenant promises are rooted in His Holy calling - **v.16a**
 - **Romans 11:28**
 - God's covenant faithfulness sustains His redemptive people - **v.16b**
 - **Galatians 3:16; Romans 9:6; Philippians 1:6**

So, What?

- How should these truths change the way we live?
 - Three ways God's redemptive plan should shape our lives:
 - Live a life that makes Christ beautiful
 - Does my life make Jesus look beautiful?
 - Trust God's providence even when you don't understand His ways
 - Never stop believing that God can restore
