(Colossians 2:13-15 NIV) When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made you alive with Christ. And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.

(Galatians 5:1 NASB) It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery.

(Galatians 5:4) For if you are trying to make yourselves right with God by keeping the law, you have been cut off from Christ! You have fallen away from God’s grace.
