

JESUS IN GENESIS

- Jesus spoke the creation into existence, 1:3; John 1:1-3.
- Jesus was pictured through the flood and the safety of the ark, 6:14-8:22
- The preincarnate Christ visited Hagar when she felt hopeless in the desert 16:11-13.
- The preincarnate Christ visited Abraham before the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah, 18:1-33.
- In Abraham's obedience to offer Isaac as a sacrifice we have a picture of God the Father sacrificing God the Son at Calvary 22:1-24.
- Abraham sending his servant to a far away land to get a bride for his son Isaac is a picture of God the Father sending the Holy Spirit to earth to get a bride for God the Son, chap. 24.
- When Jacob wrestled with God in 32:24-30 he was wrestling with the preincarnate Christ.
- Joseph's entire life is a picture of Christ being sent from heaven to a hostel world to be killed and raised to glory to make a way for many to be saved 37-50.

• To Humanity

The book of Genesis answers mans' most profound question of life.

- > Where did I come from?
- > What is my purpose in life?
- > The first eleven chapters of Genesis explains:
 - ❖ The Creation the answer to where we came from who we are and what life is about
 - ❖ The Fall the answer to how evil came into the world
 - The Flood the answer to why government is important
 - The Tower the answer to why globalism is wrong

• To Christianity

Christianity rests upon the Old Testament, thus without the book of Genesis the New Testament has no framework of reference and becomes meaningless. The ideas such as a Savior for the world, a King for Israel, and a future kingdom would not make sense apart from Genesis. This is why there is such an attack today on what is contained in the book of Genesis, regarding creation, marriage, the value of life, etc.

THE IMPORTANCE OF GENESIS

• To the Bible


Genesis is the one book that is tied to every other book in the Bible.

- Exodus, Numbers, Joshua, Judges, I & II Sam, I & II Kings, Ezra, and Nehemiah all chronicle the history of God's promise to make a great nation of Abraham.
- > <u>Job, Leviticus, Deuteronomy, Ruth, I & II Chronicles, and Esther</u> either fill in the gaps of Israel's national identity as Abraham's seed and God's chosen people, or they reveal the nature of the God of Genesis.
- > <u>Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon</u> reveal how relational the God of Genesis is to mankind.
- > <u>The Major and Minor Prophets</u>, of which there are 17 books, all address God's future promise to Adam to send a Savior and to Abraham to give him national and universal blessings.
- > <u>The Gospels</u> are the fulfillment of God's promise to send a Savior to the world through the seed Abraham.
- > <u>The book of Acts and the Epistles</u> are a partial fulfillment of the promise to Abraham to bless all the families of the earth through him
- > <u>The book of Revelation</u> is the story of how God finally takes back what was affectively lost by sin in the Garden of Eden.


CHART OF THE AGES

A Dispensational Chart of the Ages


THE AGE OF INNOCENCE Genesis 2:25
