## OLD TESTAMENT READING

*Malachi 3:13–18*

(The Lord makes His claim on His treasured possession, declaring “they shall be Mine.”)

<sup>13</sup> “Your words have been hard against Me, says the LORD. But you say, ‘How have we spoken against You?’ <sup>14</sup> You have said, ‘It is vain to serve God. What is the profit of our keeping His charge or of walking as in mourning before the LORD of hosts? <sup>15</sup> And now we call the arrogant blessed. Evil-doers not only prosper but they put God to the test and they escape.’” <sup>16</sup> Then those who feared the LORD spoke with one another. (Upon the cross, Jesus is enthroned as King and speaks of forgiveness and paradise.)

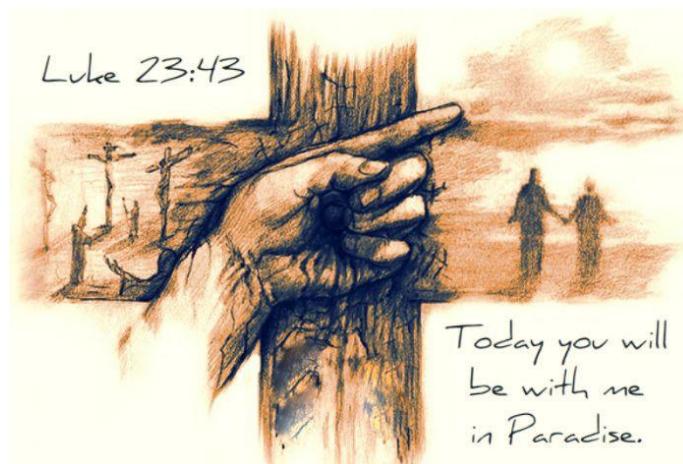
**Pastor:**      The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-third chapter.

<sup>27</sup> And there followed [Jesus] a great multitude of the people and of women who were mourning and lamenting for Him. <sup>28</sup> But turning to them Jesus said, “Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for Me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. <sup>29</sup> For behold, the days are coming when they will say, ‘Blessed are the barren and the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed!’ <sup>30</sup> Then they will begin to say to the mountains, ‘Fall on us,’ and to the hills, ‘Cover us.’ <sup>31</sup> For if they do these things when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?” <sup>32</sup> Two others, who were criminals, were led away to be put to death with Him. <sup>33</sup> And when they came to the place that is called The Skull, there they crucified Him, and the criminals, one on His right and one on His left. <sup>34</sup> And Jesus said, “Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.” And they cast lots to divide His garments. <sup>35</sup> And the people stood by, watching, but the rulers scoffed at Him, saying, “He saved others; let Him save Himself, if He is the Christ of God, His Chosen One!” <sup>36</sup> The soldiers also mocked Him, coming up and offering Him sour wine <sup>37</sup> and saying, “If you are the King of the Jews, save Yourself!” <sup>38</sup> There was also an inscription over Him, “This is the King of the Jews.” <sup>39</sup> One of the criminals who were hanged railed at Him, saying, “Are you not the Christ? Save Yourself and us!” <sup>40</sup> But the other rebuked him, saying, “Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? <sup>41</sup> And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this Man has done nothing wrong.” <sup>42</sup> And he said, “Jesus, remember me when You come into Your kingdom.” <sup>43</sup> And He said to him, “Truly, I say to you, today you will be with Me in paradise.”
