POINTS PONDER

Misplaced Abiding Produces Misaligned Fruit

“They forsook the LORD... and followed other gods.”
- Judges 2:11-13

Israel didn't abandon worship—they **redirected it**.
You cannot drink from the cup of the Lord and the cup of idols.

POINTS PONDER

Inherited Blessings Without Developed Roots

*“Another generation arose... who did not know the
LORD.” - Judges 2:8-10*

They knew the **land**, but not the **Lord**. They inherited territory without intimacy.
Spiritual proximity does not equal spiritual connection.

POINTS PONDER

Neglect Not So Great a Salvation

“How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation...” - Hebrews 2:3

Without continual connection, revival becomes **seasonal**, not sustainable.
Communion is a rhythm of abiding. It interrupts cycles of spiritual drift.

POINTS PONDER

Do THIS...

“The people served the LORD all the days of Joshua...” - Judges 2:6-7

Their obedience was not rooted in Joshua—it was rooted in **personal encounter** with God.
Fruit is evidence of ongoing connection, not past experience

As we come to the Lord's Table:
REMEMBER

**This bread represents a life rooted in Christ—
daily dependence, daily obedience.**

**This cup represents renewed
covenant connection—washed,
restored, and re-grafted.**
