#### **Overcoming Sexual Strongholds**

John 8:1-11 (NLT) Jesus returned to the Mount of Olives, <sup>2</sup> but early the next morning he was back again at the Temple. A crowd soon gathered, and he sat down and taught them. <sup>3</sup> As he was speaking, the teachers of religious law and the Pharisees brought a woman who had been caught in the act of adultery. They put her in front of the crowd. 4 "Teacher," they said to Jesus, "this woman was caught in the act of adultery. <sup>5</sup> The law of Moses says to stone her. What do you say?" <sup>6</sup> They were trying to trap him into saying something they could use against him, but Jesus stooped down and wrote in the dust with his finger. <sup>7</sup> They kept demanding an answer, so he stood up again and said, "All right, but let the one who has never sinned throw the first stone!" 8 Then he stooped down again and wrote in the dust. <sup>9</sup> When the accusers heard this, they slipped away one by one, beginning with the oldest, until only Jesus was left in the middle of the crowd with the woman. <sup>10</sup> Then Jesus stood up again and said to the woman, "Where are your accusers? Didn't even one of them condemn you?" 11 "No, Lord," she said. And Jesus said, "Neither do I. Go and sin no more."

- We are all sexually broken.
- Jesus meets us where we are, and as we are, but He doesn't leave us there.
- We meet people where they are, as they are, nourishing their <u>faith identity</u> in Christ.
- Sexual sin & brokenness is the result of rejecting God's design for sexuality.
- God created sex good and for our good.

Matthew 19: 1-6 (NIV) When Jesus had finished saying these things, he left Galilee and went into the region of Judea to the other side of the Jordan. <sup>2</sup> Large crowds followed him, and he healed them there. <sup>3</sup> Some Pharisees came to him to test him. They asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any and every reason?" <sup>4</sup> "Haven't you read," he replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,'<sup>5</sup> and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? <sup>6</sup> So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Mark 7:21-23 (NLT) For from within, out of a person's heart, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, <sup>22</sup> adultery, greed, wickedness, deceit, lustful desires, envy, slander, pride, and foolishness. <sup>23</sup> All these vile things come from within; they are what defile you."

1 Thessalonians 4:1-10 (NLT) Finally, dear brothers and sisters, we urge you in the name of the Lord Jesus to live in a way that pleases God, as we have taught you. You live this way already, and we encourage you to do so even more. <sup>2</sup> For you remember what we taught you by the authority of the Lord Jesus. <sup>3</sup> God's will is for you to be holy, so stay away from all sexual sin. <sup>4</sup> Then each of you will control his own body and live in holiness and honour—<sup>5</sup> not in lustful passion like the pagans who do not know God and his ways. <sup>6</sup> Never harm or cheat a fellow believer in this matter by violating his wife, for the Lord avenges all such sins, as we have solemnly warned you before. <sup>7</sup> God has called us to live holy lives, not impure lives. <sup>8</sup> Therefore, anyone who refuses to live by these rules is not disobeying human teaching but is rejecting God, who gives his Holy Spirit to you. <sup>9</sup> But we don't need to write to you about the importance of loving each other, for God himself has taught you to love one another. <sup>10</sup> Indeed, you already show your love for all the believers throughout Macedonia. Even so, dear brothers and sisters, we urge you to love them even more.

Big Idea: Choose to walk in God's <u>design</u> for your <u>sexuality</u> to experience true Life.

- Submit to God's design for your sexuality.
- Pursue intimacy with Jesus Christ to experience a flourishing life.

## Overcoming Sexual Strongholds #7 of 10 - November 26, 2023

- 1) Last week we looked at Overcoming Rejection and Hurt from John 1:1-14. How has God been speaking to you this week in this regard? What did you learn and apply this week?
- 2) Read John 8:1-11. What is the **Context** for this passage? Who is the writer and the recipients? Where does this fit in the book as a whole? What are the circumstances?
- 3) **Observation:** What "jumps out" in this passages? What interesting details do you observe? What questions come up about the passage? What is the major theme in the passage?
- 4) **Meaning:** What was the meaning for the original recipients? What meaning is inferred in this passage for us?
- 5) How does Jesus communicate grace and truth to this woman?
- 6) Read Matthew 19:1-6 and Mark 7:21-23. What does Jesus teach about God's design for marriage and sexuality.
- 7) Read 1 Thessalonians 4:1-10. What does this passage affirm about God's design for sexuality? What questions does this raise for you?
- 8) **Application:** How is God speaking to you today through this message? What steps do you need to take to walk in God's design for your sexuality so you experience a flourishing life.
- 9) Reflect on the specific action steps and consider how you can apply them.

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
