How to Become Rich Compassion Sunday

1 Timothy 6:17-19 (NLT) "Teach those who are rich in this world not to be proud and not to trust in their money, which is so unreliable. Their trust should be in God, who richly gives us all we need for our enjoyment. ¹⁸ Tell them to use their money to do good. They should be rich in good works and generous to those in need, always being ready to share with others. ¹⁹ By doing this they will be storing up their treasure as a good foundation for the future so that they may experience true life."

1 Timothy 6:9 (NLT) "But people who long to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many foolish and harmful desires that plunge them into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil."

Generosity is the antidote to our $\underline{\text{greed}}$ because it reminds us to $\underline{\text{imitate}}$ our generous God.

Living a truly generous life is the <u>rich life</u>. How do we live a rich life?

- Use money for good.
- Be rich in good deeds.
- Be generous to those in need.
- Always be ready to share with others.
- See generous living as a way to imitate the generous grace of Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians 8:7-9 (NLT) "Since you excel in so many ways—in your faith, your gifted speakers, your knowledge, your enthusiasm, and your love from us—I want you to excel also in this gracious act of giving. ⁸ I am not commanding you to do this. But I am testing how genuine your love is by comparing it with the eagerness of the other churches. ⁹ You know the generous grace of our Lord Jesus Christ. Though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty he could make you rich."
