Maximizing Spiritual Growth = A Faithful, Fruitful, & Fulfilled Life.

What will it take to maximize your spiritual growth this year?

• Be Faithful to Maximize your Gifts.

2 Timothy 1:3-7 (NLT) "I remember your genuine faith, for you share the faith that first filled your grandmother Lois and your mother, Eunice. And I know that same faith continues strong in you. ⁶ This is why I remind you to fan into flames the spiritual gift God gave you when I laid my hands on you. ⁷ For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline."

• Be Faithful to Share Christ Boldly.

2 Timothy 1:8 (NLT) "So never be ashamed to tell others about our Lord."

• Be Faithful in the Midst of Suffering.

2 Timothy 1:8b (NLT) "And don't be ashamed of me, either, even though I'm in prison for him. With the strength God gives you, be ready to suffer with me for the sake of the Good News."

• Be Faithful to Guard the Truth in Love.

2 Timothy 1:13-14 (NLT) "Hold on to the pattern of wholesome teaching you learned from me—a pattern shaped by the faith and love that you have in Christ Jesus. ¹⁴ Through the power of the Holy Spirit who lives within us, carefully guard the precious truth that has been entrusted to you."

John 14:6 (NLT) "I am the way, the truth, and the life, no one comes to the Father apart from me."

Big Idea: <u>Maximize</u> your spiritual growth, as you <u>trust</u> in the Faithful One.

2 Timothy 1:9-12 (NLT) For God saved us and called us to live a holy life. He did this, not because we deserved it, but because that was his plan from before the beginning of time—to show us his grace through Christ Jesus. ¹⁰ And now he has made all of this plain to us by the appearing of Christ Jesus, our Saviour. He broke the power of death and illuminated the way to life and immortality through the Good News. ¹¹ And God chose me to be a preacher, an apostle, and a teacher of this Good News. That is why I am suffering here in prison. ¹² But I am not ashamed of it, for I know the one in whom I trust, and I am sure that he is able to guard what I have entrusted to him until the day of his return.

• We are trophies of grace.

- We have been given <u>life</u> not death.
- We have been chosen for a purpose.
- We have been given a Spirit of power, love, and self-discipline (sound mind).
- We can trust God because He is faithful even when we are not.

2 Timothy 2:13 (NLT) $\,$ "If we are unfaithful, he remains faithful, for he cannot deny who he is."

- Last week we looked at 4 questions to help us prepare for 2022 with Dr. Steve Brown. Where did you see God working in your life in this regard this past week? How did your action step go?
- 2) Read 2 Timothy 1:3-14. What is the **Context** for this passage? Where is this taking place in the book as a whole (what comes before or after)? Who is the writer and who are the recipients? Where does it fit in the Bible? What's the theme of this chapter, or passage? What's the historical and cultural context?
- 3) **Observation:** What "jumps out" in this passage? What interesting details do you observe? Is anything repeated? What questions come up about the passage? Are there connecting words or ideas?
- 4) **Meaning:** What was the meaning for the original recipients? What meaning is inferred in this passage for us and what does this tell us about being faithful disciples for Jesus Christ?
- 5) Read 2 Timothy 2:13. What are the implications for us as people who desire to follow Christ? What does it look like for you to be faithful to Jesus Christ?
- 6) **Application:** How is God speaking to you through this passage? (Take some time for Listening Prayer). How does this passage call on you to change the way you live as your enter 2022? What will you do this week as a result of this teaching? What aspect of this teaching do you need to pass on to others?



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
