Reasonable Worship

Have you ever had an encounter with someone that forever changed your life?

What do we need to know about Holy God and how do we respond to Him?

Isaiah 6:1-4 (NLT) It was in the year King Uzziah died that I saw the Lord. He was sitting on a lofty throne, and the train of his robe filled the Temple. ² Attending him were mighty seraphim, each having six wings. With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. ³ They were calling out to each other, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of Heaven's Armies! The whole earth is filled with his glory! ⁴ Their voices shook the Temple to its foundations, and the entire building was filled with smoke.

• God is Holy, Holy, Holy.

Isaiah 6:5 (NLT) Then I said, "It's all over! I am doomed, for I am a sinful man. I have filthy lips, and I live among a people with filthy lips. Yet I have seen the King, the Lord of Heaven's Armies."

Isaiah 6:5 (NKJV) So I said: "Woe is me, for I am undone! (NKJV)

• In the presence of Holy God, humans are undone.

Romans 3:23 (NLT) "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard."

Isaiah 6:6-7 (NLT) Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a burning coal he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. ⁷ He touched my lips with it and said, "See, this coal has touched your lips. Now your guilt is removed, and your sins are forgiven."

God takes the initiative to purify and forgive.

Isaiah 6:8 (NLT) Then I heard the Lord asking, "Whom should I send as a messenger to this people? Who will go for us?" I said, "Here I am. Send me.

From brokenness to mission is the pattern for humankind.

We are redeemed for a reason. We are saved to serve. We are healed to help.

Big Idea: The only reasonable response to God's grace is decisive dedication.

How do you respond to God's grace with decisive dedication?

Romans 12:1-2 (AMP) Therefore I urge you, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies [dedicating all of yourselves, set apart] as a living sacrifice, holy and well-pleasing to God, which is your rational (logical, intelligent) act of worship. ² And do not be conformed to this world [any longer with its superficial values and customs], but be transformed and progressively changed [as you mature spiritually] by the renewing of your mind [focusing on godly values and ethical attitudes], so that you may prove [for yourselves] what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His plan and purpose for you].

• <u>Surrender</u> in response to God's grace.

"....[dedicate all of yourselves] as a living sacrifice, holy and well-pleasing to God, which is your rational (logical, intelligent) act of worship..."

• Separate yourself & be Set-apart for God.

"...And do not be conformed to this world [any longer with its superficial values and customs], but be transformed and progressively changed [as you mature spiritually] by the renewing of your mind [focusing on godly values and ethical attitudes]..."

• <u>See</u> & <u>Sense</u> God's will & then <u>Step</u> into it.

"...so that you may prove [for yourselves] what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect [in His plan and purpose for you]."

• The only reasonable response to God's grace is decisive dedication.

Reasonable Worship #4 of 4 - October 8, 2023

- 1) Last week we looked at Hebrews 12:18-29 and what it means to worship God with reverence and awe. How has God been speaking to you this week in this regard? What did you learn and apply this week?
- 2) Read Isaiah 6:1-8. What is the **Context** for this passage? Where is this taking place in the book as a whole (what comes before or after)? Who is the writer and who are the recipients? Where does it fit in the Bible? What's the historical and cultural context?
- 3) **Observation:** What "jumps out" in this passages? What interesting details do you observe? What questions come up about the passage? What is the major theme in the passage?
- 4) **Meaning:** What was the meaning for the original recipients? What meaning is inferred in this passage for us?
- 5) What do learn about God in this passage and what does it tell us about us? What is the significance of the "burning coal from the altar"?
- 6) Read Romans 12:1-2. How does this passage reflect what we see in Isaiah 6 and also give us a clear way to walk out "decisive dedication in response to God's grace'?
- 7) **Application:** What steps is God asking you to take to respond to His grace with decisive dedication?
- 8) Take time to prayerfully reflect on Isaiah 6 and Romans 12:1-2 and pray "Here I am send me!" Ask God where he wants to send you and respond in faith and obedience.



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
