Blessed Are You With Jeremy Vasic April 14, 2024

Where the <u>Pharisees</u> say being blessed is about <u>what you do</u>, Jesus says being blessed is about <u>who you are</u>.

Matthew 5:1-12 One day as he saw the crowds gathering, Jesus went up on the mountainside and sat down. His disciples gathered around him, 2 and he began to teach them.

- **3** "God blesses those who are poor and realize their need for him, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.
- ⁴ God blesses those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- **5** God blesses those who are humble, for they will inherit the whole earth.
- **6** God blesses those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be satisfied.
- 7 God blesses those who are merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- **8** God blesses those whose hearts are pure, for they will see God.
- **9** God blesses those who work for peace, for they will be called the children of God.
- 10 God blesses those who are persecuted for doing right, for the Kingdom of Heaven is theirs.

¹¹ "God blesses you when people mock you and persecute you and lie about you and say all sorts of evil things against you because you are my followers.
¹² Be happy about it! Be very glad! For a great reward awaits you in heaven. And remember, the ancient prophets were persecuted in the same way.

Where the <u>world</u> says being blessed is about what you <u>gain</u>, Jesus says being blessed is about what you <u>lose</u>.

Where we say being blessed is personal, Jesus says being blessed is relational.

Big Idea: <u>Experience</u> God's Kingdom blessing through your <u>formation</u>, your <u>losses,</u> and your <u>relational</u> faith.
