Becoming Faithful Seekers With Ryan Dawson, Lead Pastor November 22, 2020



At Sequoia we long to see thousands of people experience the Kingdom of Jesus together, wherever we live, work, play, and go.

What are values or spiritual underpinnings that serve as the foundation for Sequoia's vision?

• We will grow in <u>devotion</u> to God and His Word.

Proverbs 3:1-2 "My child, never forget the things I have taught you. Store my commands in your heart. ² If you do this, you will live many years, and your life will be satisfying."

• We will grow in love and kindness.

Proverbs 3:3-4 "Never let loyalty and kindness leave you! Tie them around your neck as a reminder. Write them deep within your heart. ⁴ Then you will find favour with both God and people, and you will earn a good reputation."

• We will grow in faith and prayer.

Proverbs 3:5-6 "Trust in the Lord with all your heart; do not depend on your own understanding. ⁶ Seek his will in all you do, and he will show you which path to take."

"Don't be busy solvers but be faithful seekers!"

• We will grow in <u>humility</u> and <u>holiness</u>.

Proverbs 3:7-8 "Don't be impressed with your own wisdom. Instead, fear the Lord and turn away from evil.⁸ Then you will have healing for your body and strength for your bones."

• We will grow in generosity.

Proverbs 3:9-10 "Honour the Lord with your wealth and with the best part of everything you produce. ¹⁰ Then he will fill your barns with grain, and your vats will overflow with good wine."

• We will grow in teachability and repentance.

Proverbs 3:11-12 "My child, don't reject the Lord's discipline, and don't be upset when he corrects you. ¹² For the Lord corrects those he loves, just as a father corrects a child in whom he delights."

• Jesus Christ embodies all <u>wisdom</u> and He enables us to grow in Christlikeness.

1 Corinthians 1:24-31 (NLT) "...Christ is the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ This foolish plan of God is wiser than the wisest of human plans, and God's weakness is stronger than the greatest of human strength... ³⁰ God has united you with Christ Jesus. For our benefit God made him to be wisdom itself. Christ made us right with God; he made us pure and holy, and he freed us from sin. ³¹ Therefore, as the Scriptures say, 'If you want to boast, boast only about the Lord.'"

Big Idea: We will seek Christ and His Kingdom first.

- <u>Remember</u> God's vision for our church.
- This Week's Missional Challenge: Bless your local Food Bank

Proverbs 3:13-18 (NLT) (*italics mine*) Joyful is the person who finds [*Jesus*], the one who gains [*Jesus*]. ¹⁴ For [*Jesus*] is more profitable than silver, and [*his*] wages are better than gold. ¹⁵ [*Jesus*] is more precious than rubies; nothing you desire can compare with [him]. ¹⁶ [*Jesus*] offers you long life in [*his*] right hand, and riches and honour in [*his*] left. ¹⁷[*Jesus*] will guide you down delightful paths; all [his] ways are satisfying. ¹⁸ [*Jesus*] is a tree of life to those who embrace [*him*]; happy are those who hold [*him*] tightly.

1) Which "promise" from the 100 Days of Impact was most significant for you this week and why? Where have you seen God working as you engage with the weekly Missional Challenges?

2) How did the message resonate with you? What questions or comments did it raise for you?

3) Read Proverbs 3:1-12. How would you define wisdom and why does it make a difference? What do you find most impactful about this passage?

4) How many times does King Solomon mention the "heart" in Proverbs 3:1-12. Why is this significant? What is the relationship between our heart and our devotion to God and His Word?

5) Reflect on Proverbs 3:5-6. What does it mean to "lean on our own understanding?" How is this different from "trusting in the Lord"? In what ways do you tend to lean on your own understanding and how can you trust the Lord in greater ways?

6) Reflect on Proverbs 3:7-12. What do we learn about humility, generosity, and teachability in these verses? What promises does God give us if we embrace these principles? How is God challenging you to grow in these areas?

7) Read 1 Corinthians 1:24-31. How is Christ the embodiment of wisdom? How does this passage explain the Gospel and why does this help you trust Jesus Christ with your life?

8) In what way is God asking you to seek Christ and His Kingdom first. What specific steps can you take today to grow as a faithful seeker as an individual and an Impact Community?



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
