Overcoming Discouragement & Despair

2 Corinthians 10:5 (NIV) "We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ."

Stronghold = anything that exalts itself in our minds, "pretending" to be bigger or more powerful than our God.

Jesus has already won the <u>victory</u> over our strongholds.

Where do you go when life brings discouragement & despair?

Psalm 42 (NLT) For the choir director: A psalm of the descendants of Korah. As the deer longs for streams of water, so I long for you, O God. ² I thirst for God, the living God. When can I go and stand before him? ³ Day and night I have only tears for food, while my enemies continually taunt me, saying, "Where is this God of yours." 4 My heart is breaking as I remember how it used to be: I walked among the crowds of worshipers, leading a great procession to the house of God, singing for joy and giving thanks amid the sound of a great celebration! 5 Why am I discouraged? Why is my heart so sad? I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again—my Saviour and ⁶ my God! Now I am deeply discouraged, but I will remember you - even from distant Mount Hermon, the source of the Jordan, from the land of Mount Mizar, 7 I hear the tumult of the raging seas as your waves and surging tides sweep over me. ⁸ But each day the Lord pours his unfailing love upon me, and through each night I sing his songs, praving to God who gives me life, 9 "O God my rock," I cry, "Why have you forgotten me? Why must I wander around in grief, oppressed by my enemies?" 10 Their taunts break my bones. They scoff, "Where is this God of yours?" 11 Why am I discouraged? Why is my heart so sad? I will put my hope in God! I will praise him again-my Saviour and my God!

"Where is this God of yours?"

2 Corinthians 1:8 (NIV) "We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about the troubles we experienced in the province of Asia. We were under great pressure, far beyond our ability to endure, so that we despaired of life itself. 9 Indeed, we felt we had received the sentence of death. But this happened that we might not rely on ourselves but on God, who raises the dead.

Put your hope in God, not your circumstances.

Practice the Gaze vs Glance Principle

• Praise God even when you don't feel like it.

Romans 10:17 (NLT) "Consequently, faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ."

Isaiah 61:1-4 (NLT) The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, for the Lord has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to comfort the broken-hearted and to proclaim that captives will be released and prisoners will be freed. ² He has sent me to tell those who mourn that the time of the Lord's favour has come, and with it, the day of God's anger against their enemies. ³ To all who mourn in Israel, he will give a crown of beauty for ashes, a joyous blessing instead of mourning, festive praise instead of despair. In their righteousness, they will be like great oaks that the Lord has planted for his own glory. ⁴ They will rebuild the ancient ruins, repairing cities destroyed long ago. They will revive them, though they have been deserted for many generations.

- The $\underline{\text{remedy}}$ to our discouragement is a $\underline{\text{recognition}}$ that God is with us & for us.

Big Idea: Embrace the <u>presence</u> of Christ to overcome discouragement & despair.
