How do we live faithfully in community?

Living as faithful communities means to live as <u>family</u>.

Show honour to those who lead us.

1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 Dear brothers and sisters, honour those who are your leaders in the Lord's work. They work hard among you and give you spiritual guidance. ¹³ Show them great respect and wholehearted love because of their work. And live peacefully with each other.

Don't be afraid to <u>challenge</u> one another.

1 Thessalonians 5:14 Brothers and sisters, we urge you to warn those who are lazy.

1 Corinthians 5:12 (NLT) It isn't my responsibility to judge outsiders, but it certainly is your responsibility to judge those inside the church who are sinning.

1 Corinthians 5:11-12 (MSG) But I am saying that you shouldn't act as if everything is just fine when a friend who claims to be a Christian is promiscuous or crooked, is flip with God or rude to friends, gets drunk or becomes greedy and predatory. You can't just go along with this, treating it as acceptable behavior. I'm not responsible for what the outsiders do, but don't we have some responsibility for those within our community of believers?

Don't fear walking through fear.

1 Thessalonians 5:14 Encourage those who are timid.

Look out for the <u>vulnerable</u>.

1 Thessalonians 5:14 Take tender care of those who are weak.

Live with a greater purpose and a higher love.

1 Thessalonians 5:14-15 Be patient with everyone. ¹⁵ See that no one pays back evil for evil, but always try to do good to each other and to all people.

John 13:34-35 So now I am giving you a new commandment: Love each other. Just as I have loved you, you should love each other. ³⁵ Your love for one another will prove to the world that you are my disciples.

Big Idea: Live out our identity as <u>family</u>, united by the <u>purposes</u> of God and the l<u>ove</u> of Christ.

8) What is uniting us as a Church family? What is uniting us as an Impact Community? How can we ensure that we are strongly united by God's purposes for us and by Christ's love in us?



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
