- 5. Read John 1:1-14, and Hebrews 1:1-3. In what way is Jesus a prophetic "word" from God? What is God saying to us through Jesus?
- 6. Read Matthew 2:2,6. What do we learn about Jesus? What does it mean for Jesus to be King in your life? In what way do you need to led more by Christ?
- 7. Read 1 Peter 2:9. What does this passage tell us about our identity as believers? What would it look like for you to live out this identity where you live work, play, and go? Choose an action step for each role.

Proverb 13:12 "Hope deferred makes the heart sick, but a longing fulfilled is a tree of life."

What are you longing for today?

Big Idea: Seeking the Jesus who is - fulfills our deepest needs and purpose.

Matthew 2:1-12 Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the reign of King Herod. About that time some wise men from eastern lands arrived in Jerusalem, asking, ² "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star as it rose, and we have come to worship him." ³ King Herod was deeply disturbed when he heard this, as was everyone in Jerusalem. ⁴ He called a meeting of the leading priests and teachers of religious law and asked, "Where is the Messiah supposed to be born?"

⁵ "In Bethlehem in Judea," they said, "for this is what the prophet wrote:

⁶ 'And you, O Bethlehem in the land of Judah, are not least among the ruling cities of Judah,

for a ruler will come from you

who will be the shepherd for my people Israel."

⁷Then Herod called for a private meeting with the wise men, and he learned from them the time when the star first appeared. ⁸Then he told them, "Go to Bethlehem and search carefully for the child. And when you find him, come back and tell me so that I can go and worship him, too!" ⁹ After this interview the wise men went their way. And the star they had seen in the east guided them to Bethlehem. It went ahead of them and stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were filled with joy! ¹¹ They entered the house and saw the child with his mother, Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasure chests and gave him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹² When it was time to leave, they returned to their own country by another route, for God had warned them in a dream not to return to Herod.

- 2) The identity of Jesus answers our deepest needs.
 - We need to be forgiven. Hebrews 4:14-16 Hebrews 9:11-12
 - We need to be loved. Hebrews 1:1-3
 - We need to be led. Matthew 2:2,6
- 3) The identity of Jesus points to our greatest purpose.

1 Peter 2:9 ...for you are a chosen people. You are royal priests, a holy nation, God's very own possession. As a result, you can show others the goodness of God, for he called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

- We are "prophets" who <u>speak</u> for God and <u>show</u> others the goodness of God.
- We are "priests" who continue to <u>connect</u> people to the grace of the Gospel.
- We are "kings" who co-lead with Christ in the <u>renewal</u> of all things.
