#### The Power of God #5 of 10— August 5, 2018

- 1) Take some time to discuss how your IC has been and will live out the Kingdom of Jesus together.
  - In what ways have we been living out our **family** identity recently? How will we do this in the next couple weeks?
  - How have we lived as servants to one another or to our world this past week? What needs or opportunities to serve is God asking us to lean into?
  - How have we lived **on mission** where we live, work, play, or went this past week? Who do we know that needs to hear the good news of Jesus?

2) What did you find most helpful, encouraging, or challenging in this message?

3) Share about a powerful experience in nature you've had. How did it make you feel? How can we turn watching nature into a worshipful experience?

4) Have you ever had an experience where you felt God was speaking directly to you through a passage of the Bible? Share about it. What did he say? How did it impact you? What did you do about it?

5) Reflect on the Big Idea. What is your attitude about reading the Bible these days? Do you believe that God wants to speak powerfully into your life through the Bible?

6) What does an *empowered life* look like for a follower of Jesus? Are you living one, or do you feel you are living a *powerless* life?

7) One danger for Christians is chasing after powerful experiences rather than the person of Jesus. What can you do to make sure your heart is primarily chasing a deeper relationship with Jesus himself? What will you as an Impact Community do to help each other stay focused on pursuing Jesus through His Word?

- God's power is <u>activated</u> by his <u>voice.</u>
  - Genesis 1: God spoke creation into being.
  - The Gospels: Jesus healed and cast out demons by his words.
  - Hebrews 4:12 "For the Word of God is <u>alive</u> and <u>powerful</u>. It is sharper than the sharpest two-edged sword, cutting between soul and spirit, between joint and marrow. It exposes our innermost thoughts and desires."

Big Idea: The <u>Power</u> of God is encountered in the <u>Word</u> of God.

- Question: Are you living an *empowered* life?
- A Danger: Chasing after <u>powerful</u> <u>experiences</u> instead of the <u>person of</u> <u>Jesus.</u>
- Instead, experience the <u>power</u> of God in your life by pursuing God's <u>voice</u> through <u>His Word</u>.
