 - a. At home.
 - b. At work or school.
 - c. With friends.
 - d. In your neighbourhood and community.
- 5. Read. Ephesians 4:15 but study the whole chapter for the context. What does it mean to "speak the truth in love." Why is this hard to do?
- 6. Read Proverbs 29:20, 13:3, & 21:23. Do you find it hard to listen before speaking? Why or why not?
- 7. Read Proverbs 15:1. How does a gentle answer turn away wrath? Have you seen this work in a real life situation?
- 8. How are the sins of pride and fear the root issues for sins of the tongue? How is the Gospel the answer to this problem in each one of us? Read Ephesians 4:20-31 and John 1:1-5.
- 9. What have you sensed God saying to you through your study and what will you do to walk in obedience?

James 3:7-10

Big Idea: Because our words have the <u>power</u> to bring <u>life</u> and <u>death</u> we use our speech <u>wisely</u>.

How do we speak wisely? How do we bring life through our words?

We speak words of blessing:

Proverbs 11:9 "With their words, the godless destroy their friends, but knowledge will rescue the righteous."

Proverbs12:18

Proverbs 12:25

Proverbs 11:11

We speak words of truth:

Proverbs 12:19 "Truthful words stand the test of time, but lies are soon exposed."

How do we guard our speech? Psalm 141:3 "Take control of what I say, O LORD, and guard my lips."

We listen & think before we speak:

Proverbs 29:20 "There is more hope for a fool than for someone who speaks without thinking."

Proverbs 13:3

Proverbs 21:23

We respond with gentleness, and patience:

Proverbs12:16 "A fool is quick tempered, but a wise person stays calm when insulted."

Proverbs 15:1

Proverbs 25:15 MSG "Patient persistence pierces through indifference; gentle speech breaks down rigid defenses."
